A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF FORT LAUDERDALE, FLORIDA, AMENDING THE FINAL OPERATING BUDGET AND PERSONNEL COMPLEMENT OF THE CITY OF FORT LAUDERDALE, FLORIDA, FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING OCTOBER 1, 2016, AND ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 2017, BY APPROPRIATING FUNDS AS SET FORTH IN CITY COMMISSION AGENDA MEMO #17-0110 AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 16-157, adopted on September 12, 2016, the City Commission of the City of Fort Lauderdale adopted the Final Operating Budget, Community Investment Plan and Personnel Complement of the City of Fort Lauderdale, Florida for the Fiscal Year beginning October 1, 2016, and ending September 30, 2017;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF FORT LAUDERDALE, FLORIDA:

<u>SECTION 1</u>. That the Final Operating Budget of the City of Fort Lauderdale for the Fiscal Year beginning October 1, 2016, and ending September 30, 2017, is hereby amended by appropriating funds as set forth in Commission Agenda Memo #17-0110, copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated herein.

<u>SECTION 2</u>. That this Resolution shall be in full force and effect upon final passage.

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission approve a resolution amending the Fiscal Year 2017 Budget and Community Investment Plan (CIP).

Background

Examples of recommended actions within the budget amendment are:

- transfer between funds:
- transfer between capital and operating budgets;
- transfer between capital projects;
- acceptance and appropriation of grant funding;
- amendment to staffing level;
- appropriation from fund balance; and
- appropriation for modified revenue and related expenditures.

Staff is recommending that the City Commission amend the FY 2017 Operating Budget. Community Investment Plan, and personnel complement by approving the following transfers and appropriations:

Transportation and Mobility

A. Appropriation of Unanticipated Revenue – Airport Fund – Additional Revenue from Amended Lease Agreement – \$17,792

Sheltair 16, LLC proposes to demolish the vacant Customs & Border Protection facility and construct a minimum 15,000 square feet of hangar, ramp, and parking facilities at a cost of approximately \$2,500,000. However, existing ramp space and a driveway for the vacant Customs & Border Protection Facility was not included in the April 2012 Amended and Restated Lease Agreement for Parcel 16. Sheltair 16, LLC requested an increase to the size of Parcel 16C to construct additional ramp space to accommodate aircraft parking and further enhance the safe and efficient flow of aircraft maneuvering around the parcel.

Staff has determined that an area totaling approximately 0.8 acres would meet the needs to properly develop the site. This additional area will result in an additional \$2,224.03 per month in rent revenue for Parcel 16 resulting in \$17,792.24 in additional revenue for Fiscal Year 2017 (February 2016 – September 2016).

Staff recommends that the City Commission amend the FY 2017 Budget in the amount of \$17,792 for additional revenue from amending a lease agreement. There is an associated CAM #16-1511.

B. Appropriation of Fund Balance – Parking Fund – Additional Design Expense on the South East Fire Station – \$50,000

During the preparation of the design plans for the South East Fire Station, Transportation and Mobility (TAM) requested additional Right-of-Way improvements be designed at the southwest corner of SW 17th Street & SW 1st Ave to advance on-street parking and sidewalks initiatives. This additional work was not included in the original scope of services between the City and the Consultant resulting in additional costs to be paid through the Parking Fund.

Staff recommends that the City Commission amend the FY 2017 Budget and Community Investment Plan in the amount of \$50,000 for additional design expense for the South East Fire Station.

C. Transfer between Capital Projects – General Fund – Downtown Walkability Projects - \$868,000

The Transportation and Mobility Department has historically budgeted for downtown mobility projects in large capital projects, one for each year. In order to better define specific projects planned and to appropriately manage and account for individual capital

2/07/2017 CAM #17-0110 projects, the larger projects are being separated into more specific down town walkability projects.

Staff recommends that the City Commission amend the FY 2017 Community Investment Plan in the amount of \$868,000 to separate larger Downtown Walkability Projects into smaller projects with defined scopes.

D. Appropriation of General Funds – Grant Fund, General Fund – Gas Tax Contribution to the Transportation Management Association – \$234,571

Annually, the City contributes Local Option Gas Tax revenue to the Transportation Management Association (TMA) to provide vital community bus shuttle service throughout the City with linkages to a network of transportation options, such as the Broward County bus service, regional Tri-Rail service, airports, and water taxis. A portion of the City's half-cent tax revenue in the amount of \$234,571 is budgeted in the General Fund Grant Match account and must be moved to the appropriate grants accounts and the Transportation and Mobility operating budget for correct accounting.

Staff recommends the City Commission amend the FY 2017 budget in the amount of \$234,571 to facilitate the City's contribution to the Transportation Management Association (TMA).

E. Appropriation of Fund Balance – Park Impact Fee Fund – Las Olas Tunnel Top Park – \$66,070

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) will manage the design of the proposed Tunnel Pedestrian Plaza project as part of a larger tunnel rehabilitation project. In a companion CAM (17 0052), tThe City is proposing to contribute \$498,720 towards the project in the form of a payment to FDOT. In order to make this commitment, \$66,070 must be added to the current project budget. This item will be contingent upon the approval of CAM #17-0052, which is scheduled for the 2.21.2017 Commission Agenda.

Staff recommends that the City Commission amend the FY 2017 Community Investment Plan budget in the amount of \$66,070 for the Las Olas Tunnel Top Park.

Police

F. Appropriation of Fund Balance – Law Enforcement Trust Fund – Acadis Readiness Suit Software – \$66,988

The Fort Lauderdale Police Department (FLPD) is required to track and record all training attended by staff for reporting and auditing purposes. This task is currently relegated to the use of Excel spreadsheet and management software called Training

Trak purchased in 2005. However, this system is outdated and does not support the needs of the FLPD moving into the 21st century. The Acadis Readiness Suite not only provides a solution to the issue above, it also allows the department to ensure compliance with state and federal training requirements through automated processes and accurate reporting.

Staff recommends that the City Commission amend the FY 2017 Budget in the amount of \$66,988 for Acadis Readiness Suit Software. There is an associated CAM #17-0177.

Information Technology Services

G. Appropriation of Fund Balance – Central Services Fund – 3D GIS Software and Hardware – \$45,000

The City wishes to evaluate growth scenarios and development outcomes resulting from changes to its land use policies. 3-Dimensional (3D) GIS mapping and analyses have emerged as a highly effective way of performing this type of evaluation and presenting the results to City staff, elected officials, and the community at large. This effort requires a 3D GIS model of the existing built environment for the Downtown Regional Activity Center, 3D GIS software to manipulate and augment the model to include proposed developments, and computing hardware capable of processing 3D GIS models.

Staff recommends that the City Commission amend the FY 2017 budget in the amount of \$45,000 for the purchase of a 3-Diimensional (3D) GIS mapping and analysis software and hardware system.

Public Works

H. Transfer between Capital Projects – General Fund – South Side School - \$260,530

This project will incur additional costs before completion due to interior finish changes; modifications to new work as a result of conflicts with existing structure; construction of a new Information Technology (IT) room on the second floor; and IT programming changes relating to security, WiFi, data, card readers, magnetic locks, and hardware. Additionally this budget transfer will fund the procurement of the IT vendor to furnish and install all devices, WiFi, cable, wire, and equipment relating to the new IT programming work.

The balance of \$165,876 is available for current use in the Annual Dredging 2012-2013 project as the project is completed. The balance of \$94,654 is available for current transfer from the Marine Facilities Maintenance project as it is a lower priority project. Funding for the lower priority project will be reprioritized to a later budget year as funds become available.

Staff recommends that the City Commission amend the FY 2017 Community Investment Plan (CIP) in the amount of \$260,530 to facilitate the completion of South Side School.

City Attorney's Office

I. Appropriation of Fund Balance – General Fund – Laptop Purchase – \$8,236

The City's ITS Department purchased laptops for the City Attorney's Office towards the end of FY 2016. Due to timing related to the use of purchasing cards, the FY 2016 charge was posted in the City Attorney's FY 2017 budget.

Staff recommends that the City Commission amend the FY 2017 budget in the amount of \$8,236 for the laptop purchase.

Fire-Rescue

J. Appropriation of Unanticipated Revenue and Expense – General Fund – Additional Revenue and Expense for Public Emergency Medical Transportation – \$793,806

The Florida PEMT (Public Emergency Medical Transport) funding program was recently established by the AHCA (Agency for Health Care Administration). A CPE Program (Certified Public Expenditure) is designed to reimburse providers based on their actual costs of providing emergency medical services to Medicaid-eligible patients. In December 2016, the Fire Rescue department submitted a cost reimbursement request in the amount of \$793,806.

The City Commission approved a contract for a Public Emergency Medical Transport Program, Consulting Services, and Revenue Recognition Process with Intermedix. This contract outlines the reimbursement (contingency fee) to be paid from the proceeds resulting from the PEMT expense reimbursement outlined above. The contingency fee is calculated at 12% of the gross proceeds and will result in an additional expense estimated at \$95,257. From this additional revenue, the Fire-Rescue department has requested to fund a shortage of \$65,193 in an approved FY 2017 budgeted project to update wireless internet service in Fire-Rescue apparatus.

Staff recommends that the City Commission amend the FY2017 budget in the amount of \$793,806 for additional revenue and expense associated with PEMT.
