TITLE: Resolution Authorizing the City Manager or an Assistant City Manager to

Sign Certain Applications Permitting the Development of City-Owned

Property

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission approve a resolution authorizing the City Manager, or an Assistant City Manager, to sign applications for any building permit, zoning permit, subdivision approval, rezoning, certification, special exception, variance, or any other official action having the effect of permitting the development of city-owned property that are not inconsistent with any expressed policy or will of the City Commission.

Background

Section 4.09(I) of the City Charter provides that the City Manager shall perform such other duties as may be prescribed under this charter, or may be required of him by motion, direction, ordinance or resolution of the City Commission.

Pursuant to Section 553.79, Florida Statutes, it is unlawful for any person, firm, corporation, or governmental entity to construct, erect, alter, modify, repair, or demolish any building within the state without first obtaining a permit from the appropriate enforcing agency. The resolution before the City Commission authorizes the City Manager or an Assistant City Manager, in their administrative capacity, to execute permit applications when it pertains to property owned by the City of Fort Lauderdale. This grant of authority to does not empower the city manager, or assistant city manager, to expressly approve development projects

Resource Impact

There is no fiscal impact associated with this action.
