**TITLE**: Motion to Execute a Third Restrictive Covenant for Museum of Discovery

and Science

### Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission approve a motion executing a Third Restrictive Covenant (Exhibit 1) for Museum of Discovery and Science providing for it to be maintained as a cultural facility in compliance with the State of Florida, Division of Cultural Affairs' Cultural Facilities Grant Program.

### **Background**

Museum of Discovery and Science, Inc. (MODS) has been approved to receive a Cultural Facilities Grant, in the amount of \$500,000, from the State of Florida, Department of State, Division of Cultural Affairs' (Division) Cultural Facilities Grant Program. The grant will assist in project funding for Museum Expansion and Renewal: Facility Renovation Phase II which will be administered by MODS. The Program requires the recordation of a Restrictive Covenant to ensure that the facility will be used as a "cultural facility" for at least ten (10) years following the execution of the grant award agreement. A cultural facility is defined as a building which shall be used primarily for the programming, production, presentation, exhibition or any combination of the above functions of any of the cultural disciplines, such as: music, dance, theatre, creative writing, literature, painting, sculpture, folks arts, photography, crafts, media arts, and historical and science museums. Last year the City Commission approved a Restrictive Covenant enabling MODS to receive a 2016 State Cultural Facilities Grant for Phase I of the museum expansion.

As a condition to receipt of the grant funds, MODS shall record this Restrictive Covenant in the public records with the Clerk of the Circuit Court of Broward County, Florida; pay all fees associated with its recording; and provide a certified copy to the Division and to the City.

#### Resource Impact

There is no financial impact associated with this item.
