Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission approve a resolution authorizing the City Manager to accept a grant from the United States Department of Homeland Security (USDHS) and the State of Florida Division of Emergency Management; and to execute any documents required to accept funds between the City of Miami and the City of Fort Lauderdale.

Background

The United States Department of Homeland Security (USDHS) has provided financial assistance to the Miami urban area in the amount of \$5,158,500 through the FY 2016 Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI) Grant Program. The urban area is defined as Miami and Fort Lauderdale collectively. The sponsoring and coordinating agency is the City of Miami via a memorandum of agreement.

The City of Fort Lauderdale has received a sub-grant in the amount of \$208,615.75 \$204,154.50 with no required match. Funds will be used towards Emergency Operations Center enhancements and maintenance (\$70,984.91), Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) training and equipment (\$24,681.82), Fort Lauderdale Police Department (FLPD) Special Weapons and Tactics (SWAT) video camera and wireless transmission device (\$32,549.39), Regional Citizens Corp training, symposium and drills (\$21,805), \$17,343.75, Region 7 Interoperable Communications Trailer, Mobile Emergency Radio System (MERS) Ultra High Frequency (UHF) Repeater (\$36,134.18) and Region 7 Interoperable Communications Trailer Mobile Emergency Radio System (MERS) Cisco Internet Protocol (IP) Phone System (\$22,460.45). The grant period began September 1, 2016 and ends December 31, June 30, 2018.

Resource Impact
There is a positive fiscal impact to the City in the amount of \$208,615.75 \$204,154.50.
Funds are being appropriated through companion agenda item, CAM #17-0112.
