Roadway and Miscellaneous Construction Services - DP Development of

the Treasure Coast, LLC - \$1,199,1011,074,442.74

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission approve a contract, in substantially the form attached, for the purchase of roadway, pedestrian, and intersection improvements via the General Roadway and Miscellaneous Construction Contract (Bid #C1347414B1) between Broward County and DP Development of the Treasure Coast, LLC (DP) in the amount of \$1,199,1014,074,442.74. It is also recommended that the City Commission authorize the City Manager, or designee, to approve renewal options coterminous with the Broward County contract contingent upon the appropriation of funds.

Background

The Las Olas Boulevard Traffic and Pedestrian Safety Study supports increasing roadway capacity and pedestrian improvements along SE 15th Avenue between Broward and Las Olas Boulevards in addition to traffic calming within the Colee Hammock neighborhood. The piggyback contract will apply to the entire segment along SE 15th Avenue. The scope includes changes to curb radii, building to comply with Americans with Disability Act accommodations, raising intersections, adding crosswalks and bulb-outs, applying stamped decorative treatments, adding pedestrian actuated lights, milling and resurfacing, new striping and pavement markings, making changes to drainage and curb inlets, and replacement of aging stormwater pipes at the Las Olas Boulevard and SE 15th Avenue intersection.

In addition, NE 15th Avenue currently experiences regular flooding during most rain events after a Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) contractor severed the connection between the City's drainage system on NE 15th Avenue and the FDOT's drainage system on Sunrise Boulevard. FDOT has agreed to allow the City to reconnect to the Sunrise Boulevard system, reestablishing the previously existing connection to alleviate flooding. The scope includes reconnecting the City's stormwater system to the FDOT's system by installing drainage pipe and 2 drainage structures, as well as restoration of the affected asphalt to FDOT standards.

Staff is recommending the use of the County contract because it includes most of the features needed to construct the identified projects above and provides expediency. Although the City's active continuing services construction contracts were reviewed, staff did not find a suitable contract to construct the projects.

Pursuant to Section 2-181(7) Code of Ordinances of the City of Fort Lauderdale, Florida, this purchase will be made in accordance with Broward County Contract No. C1347414B1 from DP in the amount of \$1,199,1011,074,442.74, whereby such contract or formal bid followed formal bid procedures of sealed written bids, public opening, and legal advertising.

Resource Impact

There will be a current fiscal year impact to the City in an estimated amount of \$1,199,1011,074,442.74, which funds are available in the accounts below.
