TITLE: Resolution Authorizing the Acceptance of Grant Funds and Execution of a
Joint Participation Agreement with Florida Department of Transportation
for Construction of Taxiway Foxtrot Pavement Rehabilitation at Fort
Lauderdale Executive Airport

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission adopt a resolution accepting grant funding in the amount of \$132,980 or 5% of the cost, whichever is less, for the construction of Taxiway Foxtrot Pavement Rehabilitation at Fort Lauderdale Executive Airport (FXE) from Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT); and authorize the City Manager to execute a Joint Participation Agreement (JPA) on behalf of the City for such funding.

Background

This project is for the milling and re-surfacing of approximately 3,600 linear feet of airfield pavement along the western section of Taxiway Foxtrot. Additionally, the taxiway intersection at Taxiways Bravo and Foxtrot will be re-constructed to conform to Federal Aviation Administration's (FAA) design standards (A/C 150/5300-13A) to improve airfield operations. New taxiway edge-lights, sodding, and pavement striping will be installed as part of the construction. The existing guidance signs will be relocated based on the new intersection layout.

The FDOT Pavement Management Plan listed Taxiway Foxtrot's Pavement Condition Index (CPI) number as 44 out of 100. This rating ranged from very poor to serious by the Airport's aviation consultant. The results indicated that the taxiway's pavement was in poor condition and in need of milling and resurfacing in several areas to extend the useful pavement life. Other areas will require the base course to be re-compacted and a new layer of asphalt applied.

Resource Impact

There is a positive fiscal impact to the City for the grant in the amount of \$132,980. The required grant match of \$132,980 is available within the project budget. This item was approved on the April 4, 2017 Consolidated Budget Amendment CAM 17-0112.
