<u>SECTION 2</u>. The City Commission certifies the following in conjunction with the Grant Application and any application for extension of time:

- A. That it will accept the terms and conditions set forth in FIND Rule 66B-2, F.A.C. which will be a part of the Project Agreement for any assistance awarded under the Application.
- B. That it is in complete accord with the attached proposal and that it will carry out the Project in the manner described in the proposal and any plans and specifications attached thereto, unless prior approval for any change has been received from FIND.
- C. That it has the ability and intention to finance its share of the cost of the Project and that the Project will be operated and maintained at the expense of the City for public use.
- D.
