TITLE:	Discussion of Right-of-Way Issues in Riviera Isles

The item before the City Commission is a briefing by the City Attorney on legal issues surrounding the ownership of an undesignated strip of land in the Riviera Isles neighborhood.

Along Riviera Isle Drive, just south of Las Olas Boulevard, is a stretch of land between the roadway and private waterbody. It includes a City stormwater pump station which alleviates localized flooding from the neighborhood, a seawall, and three docks installed by private property owners under permit from the City.

During king tides, the seawall is breached and the Riviera Isles Homeowners Association would like action taken to improve the existing seawall. However, there is now a question of ownership concerning the seawall and stretch of land in which the pump station was installed.
