- TITLE: Resolution Authorizing Execution of a License Agreement with the Florida Department of Transportation to Allow Temporary Access to the City Owned Property at 2801 SW 4th Avenue - Fire Station 3

Recommendations

It is recommended that the City Commission approve a resolution to authorize the execution of a License Agreement with the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), which allows temporary access on to the City owned property located at 2801 SW 4th Avenue for the sole purpose of installing a traffic signal pre-emption button inside Fire Station 3 and to create an aesthetically pleasing finished roadway corridor.

Background

The FDOT is currently engaged in a highway improvement project, which involves widening SW 28th Street to add left turn lanes at SW 4th Avenue and constructing a traffic signal mast arm at the intersection of SW 4th Avenue and SW 28th Street (FDOT Financial Project ID 437866-1-52-01).

A License Agreement is needed to temporarily allow FDOT to enter onto City property located at 2801 SW 4th Avenue, Fort Lauderdale, for the purpose of installing a Preemption Signal Button (traffic control device) inside Fire Station 3 and to connect the preemption button to the signal controller. Access will include the right to access, ingress and egress, and other rights that are necessary and incidental to the installation. There is no encroachment of the signal equipment or mast arm on the fire station property. As owners of the property, the City is not conveying any interest in the property to FDOT.

Resource Impact

There is no fiscal impact to the City associated with this agreement. All of the work is at FDOT's expense.
