TITLE: Motion to Approve the First Amendment to the Master Installation and
Maintenance Bus Shelter Agreement with Broward County Transit

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission approve a motion allowing the City Manager to execute the First Amendment to the Master Installation and Maintenance Bus Shelter Agreement (Exhibit 1), in substantially the form attached, with Broward County Transit (BCT) to relocate one bus shelter on Sistrunk Boulevard and install one shelter on Broward Boulevard, by Walmart, on behalf of the City, as well as update the list of shelters that have actually been installed.

Background

The City entered into an Interlocal Agreement with BCT on April 3, 2012 prior to the installation of 180 bus shelters across the City by Broward County which included a list of proposed locations. During installation of the bus shelters, there were constraints in the field that did not allow for the installation at all of the projected locations, therefore, alternative locations were identified during construction. This first amendment includes the rectification of the 204 installed shelter locations in Exhibit A to the agreement.

There was also a safety concern that was raised by neighbors at the bus shelter at stop #2411 where it was requested to relocate the bus shelter from a location on Sistrunk Boulevard near SW 12th Avenue. Significant criminal activities including drug dealing and prostitution have been documented by the Police Department at and near this bus shelter. BCT has agreed to relocate the bus shelter from its current location on the south side of Sistrunk Boulevard, just west of NW 12th Avenue, to the bus stop located on the south side of Sistrunk Boulevard near the intersection of NW 21st Terrace across from Betty's Soul Food.

The agreement for BCT to complete the work on behalf of the City is included in this amendment. The estimated cost of relocation of the bus shelter is \$15,498.10, which will be paid by the City's Transportation and Mobility Department. Maintenance of the shelter will remain the responsibility of the City in accordance with the existing agreement between the City and BCT.

Also included in the First Amendment to the Agreement is the installation of a new bus shelter at stop #723 on Broward Boulevard in front of the Riverbend Marketplace development at 2400 West Broward Boulevard (DRC Case #72-R-13). This shelter has been installed by BCT in compliance with the development approval and will be funded by the contribution made by Riverbend South, LLC for this purpose.

Resource Impact

The total project cost to relocate the shelter on Sistrunk Boulevard is estimated at \$15,498.10. The cost to install a new shelter at the Broward Boulevard location in front of Walmart is \$25,061.62 and will be funded from the \$88,000 held in a subsidiary account 219-006702. Any remaining funds following construction will be returned to Riverbend South, LLC.
