TITLE: Quasi-Judicial Resolution Granting a Waiver of Limitations at 716 Bryan

Place for the Installation of Four (4) Triple-Pile Clusters

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission adopt a Resolution granting a Waiver of Limitations for the installation of four (4) triple-pile clusters.

Background

The applicant is seeking a resolution granting a Waiver of Limitations (a waiver to allow mooring structures to extend beyond the maximum distance as defined by City Code) of Section 47-19.3 (D) of the Unified Land Development Regulations (ULDR) for the installation of four (4) triple pile clusters extending a maximum distance of +/- 62 feet from the property line into the New River.

The summary description specifies that the additional distance for the finger piers and piling clusters are necessary to safely mooring resident's vessels, as this is along a high traffic waterway, especially during high wind and severe weather.

The Marine Advisory Board (MAB) recommended approval of the application 9 to 0 (Exhibit 3). The November 2017 Marine Advisory Board Meeting was cancelled due to the boat show, therefore, draft minutes have been provided as backup for this memo.

Although there is not a fee associated with obtaining a Waiver of Limitations, an application fee in the amount of \$300 is required.

Resource Impact

There is a positive fiscal impact in the amount of \$300. Revenue related to this agreement is included in the FY2018 operating budget in the accounts listed below:
