- **TITLE:** Motion Authorizing the Execution of the Community Aesthetic Feature Agreement for City Entryway Signage with the State of Florida Department of Transportation for Non-Exclusive Access and Use of State Highway System Right-of-Way Locations.

# **Recommendation**

It is recommended that the City Commission approve a motion to authorize the execution of a Community Aesthetic Feature Agreement (CAFA) with the State of Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) for the non-exclusive access and use of State Highway System right-of-way locations to facilitate construction of City Entryway Signage.

#### Background

This project is for the construction of entryway signs announcing welcome to Fort Lauderdale. The work includes, but is not limited to, the construction of a breakaway foundation for the signs, fabrication and final installation at the following locations:

7' Wide Sign Locations:

- 6550 North Federal Hwy
- Oakland Park Blvd. Just East of Federal Highway
- Existing Sign Location at SR 84 Due East of SW 15th Avenue

3' Wide Sign Locations:

- 6550 North Federal Hwy
- Oakland Park Blvd. Just East of Federal Highway
- Existing Sign Location at SR 84 Due East of SW 15th Avenue
- Commercial Blvd. at NE 17th Avenue
- Commercial Blvd. and Dupont
- 4300 North A1A South of Flamingo Avenue
- Powerline in Front of Mills Pond Park South Side of Bridge
- Broward Blvd. East of State Road 7 / SW&NW 38th Avenue
- Davie Blvd. East of State Road 7

- Broward Blvd. and SW 15th Terrace
- Commercial Blvd. East of West Prospect Road

The Community Aesthetic Feature Agreement (CAFA) is attached as Exhibit 1.
