TITLE: Motion to Approve Purchase of Police Boats – Brunswick Commercial and

Government Products, Inc. - \$697,577

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission approve the purchase of three police boats via General Services Administration (GSA) Contract No. GS-07F-0011J from Brunswick Commercial and Government Products, Inc. (Brunswick) in the amount of \$697,577.

Background

In October 2017, the City approved Community Improvement Project #12342 for the purchase of police marine patrol vessels. These vessels will replace the current aging fleet of boats and will enhance the Fort Lauderdale Police Department's Marine Unit's ability to protect the local waterways and Port Everglades. The Fort Lauderdale Police Department's Marine Unit requested a 33' rigid hull inflatable boat (RHIB) with cabin, a 33' RHIB vessel and a 28' RHIB vessel. One vessel will have an enclosed cabin, which will allow the Marine Unit to operate in inclement weather. The other two vessels will be center console boats with folding tops. This will diversify the Marine Unit's fleet of boats with various sized boats that have different abilities.

Pursuant to Section 2-181(f)(5)(b), Code of Ordinances of the City of Fort Lauderdale, Florida, the City may piggyback a contract entered into by another governmental or public entity and a provider of supplies or services required by the City if the Chief Procurement Officer has determined that it is practicable and advantageous for the City to employ this method of procurement. The Chief Procurement Officer has determined that it is practicable and advantageous for the City to employ this method of procurement. This purchase will be made in accordance with GSA Contract No. GS-07F-0011J from Brunswick Commercial and Government Products, Inc. in the amount of \$583,960. Pursuant to the GSA contract, delivery is F.O.B. origin, which means that the City takes ownership and assumes risk of loss at the manufacturer's pick-up location where the manufacturer turns the goods over to the City's Marine Unit personnel.

Pursuant to Section 2-181(f)(3), Code of Ordinances of the City of Fort Lauderdale, Florida, the City may purchase proprietary items, as defined in Section 2-173, without the

competitive solicitation. Options in the amount of \$113,617 are not included in the options listed in the GSA Contract No. GS-07F-0011J, but must be provided at the time of manufacture from the stated manufacturer. As defined by the Code, a proprietary item is not readily available from more than one supplier, manufacturer, or person and is unique in nature. Moreover, the Interim Police Chief has determined that such options are proprietary in nature.

Resource Impact

There will be fiscal impact to the City in the amount of \$697,577.
