TITLE:	Motion to Accept a Grant of up to \$65,000 from the Florida Inland Navigation District (FIND) for Riverwalk Floating Docks Phase I Design and Permitting (BR-FL-17-127)

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission approve the acceptance of a grant award from the Florida Inland Navigation District (FIND) to fund 50% of the project cost for Phase I Design and Permitting of the Riverwalk Floating Docks, but not to exceed \$65,000.

Background

The Florida Inland Navigation District (FIND) administers the Waterway Assistance Program (WAP) program. FIND provides funding assistance to local governments within the District to provide public access to area waterways through boat ramps and floating docks.

In 2011, the City installed floating docks at four (4) locations along the New River to increase access to the Riverwalk for small boats. The project was funded in part by FIND. The floating docks are very successful as they provide waterway access to the Riverwalk and downtown daily and for special events like The Sunday Jazz Brunch. The purpose of this project is to design and permit two additional floating docks along the Riverwalk increasing waterway access downtown. One dock will be added near the existing dock at Esplanade Park and the other will be placed near the New River Inn Museum. This grant requires a match by the City of \$65,000.

Resource Impact

The total project cost is \$130,000. There is a positive fiscal impact to the City in the amount of \$65,000. There is a negative fiscal cash match impact to the City in the amount of \$65,000. Funds for the cash match are budgeted in the General Fund in FD001-9129. Funds are being appropriated contingent upon the approval of the Consolidated Budget Amendment CAM 17-1329.
