**TITLE**: Motion to Approve the Acceptance of Equipment from Good Sports, Inc.,

in the Amount of \$10,000

#### Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission approve a motion to authorize the City Manager to accept equipment from Good Sports Inc. and to execute any documents required to accept the sports equipment.

### **Background**

While at attendance at a Florida League of Cities meeting, Mayor Seiler visited the Florida Beverage Association and Florida Recycling Partnership booth. Mayor Seiler subsequently learned that the City of Fort Lauderdale's was selected as the winner of a drawing to receive \$10,000 worth of sporting equipment.

The equipment is provided solely for the benefit and growth of the City's youth sports program and may not be used for any other purpose including, but not limited to:

- No donated items may be bartered, traded or transferred in exchange for money, property, or services.
- No donated items may be given to another nonprofit organization or other entity not directly associated with the City program.
- Donated items cannot be used as prizes in any fundraising ventures, including, but not limited to, live auctions, silent auctions, raffles, or any other giveaways.
- Donated equipment cannot be given to any board of directors, officers, directors, employees, volunteers, or any other persons associated with City programs for personal use, reimbursement, or as a thank you for their service.
- City programs cannot recommend or require cash "donations" in direct or indirect exchange for product donations.
- All equipment must remain with the organization and cannot be given to youth to keep.
- Donated items cannot be distributed to youth outside of the United States or Canada.

## Resource Impact

There is no fiscal impact to the City.
