Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission adopt a resolution extending the length of term of the Infrastructure Task Force Advisory Committee to March 7, 2020.

Background

The Infrastructure Task Force Advisory Committee was created by Resolution No. 17-46 adopted on March 7, 2017, for a term of 18 months, expiring on September 7, 2018, to review and examine the condition and needs of the City's infrastructure and to prepare a report with recommendations to the City Commission regarding infrastructure improvement priorities and financing alternatives.

At the City Commission Joint Workshop with the Infrastructure Task Force Committee held on December 6, 2017, it was decided that the length of term of the committee should be extended an additional 18 months to expire on March 7, 2020.
