TITLE: Motion to Approve the Purchase of Vehicles and Proprietary Options to
Replace Totaled Vehicles - Multiple Vendors - \$1,539,228

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission approve the purchase of up to 46 vehicles, equipment, and proprietary options to replace totaled vehicles via Florida Sheriffs Association Contract No. 17-VEL25.0 from multiple vendors as identified in Exhibit 1 for a total amount not to exceed \$1,539,228.

Background

On average, 10 City vehicles are declared constructive total losses each fiscal year. During the previous three fiscal years, 36 vehicles were determined to be total losses by Risk Management; a list of each vehicle is attached as Exhibit 2; and declarations of losses for each vehicle have been attached as Exhibit 3. A majority of these vehicles are police patrol vehicles. Replacing the vehicles will allow for continuity of essential operations of the Police Department and ensuring the safety of neighbors.

Replacement of up to 10 additional vehicles is also requested in anticipation of vehicles lost due to catastrophic mechanical failure or declaration of a total loss by Risk Management during FY 2018.

Pursuant to Section 2-181(f)(5)(b), Code of Ordinances of the City of Fort Lauderdale, Florida, the City may piggyback a contract entered into by another governmental or public entity and a provider of supplies or services required by the City if the Chief Procurement Officer has determined that it is practicable and advantageous for the City to employ this method of procurement. This purchase will be made in accordance with Florida Sheriffs Association Contract No. 17-VEL25.0 from multiple vendors in the amount of \$1,439,228

Pursuant to Section 2-181(f)(3), Code of Ordinances of the City of Fort Lauderdale, Florida, the City may purchase proprietary items, as defined in Section 2-173, without the competitive solicitation. Options in the amount of up to \$100,000 are not included in the options listed in the Florida Sheriff Association Contract No. 17-VEL25.0 but must be provided at the time of manufacture from the stated manufacturer. As defined by the Code, a proprietary item is not readily available from more than one supplier, manufacturer, or person and is unique in nature. Moreover, the Public Works Director

has determined that such options are proprietary in nature.

Resource Impact

There will be a fiscal impact to the City in the amount of \$1,539,228 for Fiscal Year 2018. Funds for this purchase are available in the FY 2018 Budget in the account listed below.
