TITLE: Public Hearing Amending the Annual Action Plan for Fiscal Year 2017-

2018 Entitlement Grant Programs through the U.S. Department of

Housing and Urban Development (HUD)

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission approve the amendments to the allocations for the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), HOME Investment Partnerships, and Housing Opportunities for Persons with HIV/AIDS (HOPWA) Programs. Further, it is recommended that the City Manager be authorized to execute the necessary documents associated with amendments to the Annual Action Plan and its submittal to HUD.

Background

Each year, the City of Fort Lauderdale is required to submit an Annual Action Plan to HUD in order to continue receiving funding for its entitlement grant programs through the federal government.

In order to meet HUD's deadlines for submitting the Annual Action Plan, the City prepared and submitted its plan based on prior years' estimates because Congress had not decided on entitlement funding amounts for Fiscal Year (FY) 2017-2018. HUD has now published the true entitlement amounts for FY 2017-2018 (Exhibit 1). The City's Housing and Community Development Division has updated the Annual Action Plan to reflect the funding amounts as published by HUD (Exhibit 3).
