**TITLE:** Motion to Approve Contract for Restoration of the NW 2<sup>nd</sup> Avenue Water  
Tank – U.S.C., Inc. - \$1,185,300

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**Recommendation**

It is recommended that the City Commission approve a contract, in substantially the form attached, with U.S.C., Inc. for the restoration of the NW 2<sup>nd</sup> Avenue water tank in the amount of \$1,185,300.

**Background**

The water tank located at 625 NW 2nd Avenue is currently out of service due to its deteriorated condition. This water tower helps to maintain downtown water pressures and has a positive influence on the pressure in the Harbor Beach neighborhood. This contract is for repair services to the elevated water storage tank as well as upgrading the ladders and rails to current Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) standards. Safety railing will be added to the access hatches on top of the tank and contractor will remove and replace all the existing paint from the tank's interior and exterior surfaces. A decorative painting scheme to the entire exterior of the tank will be added. (CAM #15-0938).

On July 7, 2017, the Procurement Services Division issued Invitation to Bid Number 473-11949. Three bids were received on August 18, 2017. The bids submitted were reviewed for compliance with the specifications. U.S.C., Inc. was deemed the lowest cost, responsive, and responsible bidder and is recommended for award.

Engineering staff verified references and recommends City Commission approval to award a contract to the low bidder, U.S.C. Inc., in the amount of \$1,185,300 for rehabilitation and painting of the Northwest Second Avenue Water Tank Restoration Project. The contract duration is 240 calendar days and completion is estimated to occur by August 2018, barring unforeseen delays due to weather or other causes.

### **Resource Impact**

There will be a fiscal impact to the City in the amount of \$1,185,300 for construction, \$57,856 for estimated in-house project management fees, and bid allowance of \$50,000 for a total cost of \$1,959,156.
