





PAST PROJECTS FOR AGENCIES SIMILAR IN SIZE AND SCOPE



Sunset Memorial Gardens Cemetery - A serene new building housing vaults, meeting and grieving spaces was proposed to accommodate the growing needs of the cemetery. The intimate planting design screens maintenance areas, utilized several existing canopy trees and provides a restful setting for visitors. K&S provided hardscape, planting, irrigation design and surveying services.

Woodlawn Cemetery - "Show me your cemeteries, and I will tell you what kind of people you have" - Benjamin Franklin. This unique but almost forgotten historic African-American cemetery was revitalized when local residents mobilized to ensure that it received the recognition it deserved. The challenge for the K&S team was to respect the existing gravesites and cultural landscape. This required an intimate, detailed site analysis, as well as a responsibility and sensitivity toward the layers of history, much of it unrecorded. This meant the irrigation piping and head layout was designed in response to these conditions. Even the valve boxes were customized to mimic the pattern and profile of a grave marker. The team worked closely with the Historical Society to ensure



all known names were included on the new monuments. The result is a composition of functional walkways and resting areas with a series of story-telling memorials. These memorials were created with custom detailing of colored concrete, split-face concrete block, black granite, and stainless steel markers. Other improvements included welded metal picket fencing, custom cast steel signage, benches, and trash receptacles, each incorporated into a design concept that accommodates and preserves the historic elements of the site. Opening day was a success, with the project lauded by the local paper and attended by local citizens, preachers, and politicians. Services provided: site, planting, and irrigation design.



Rolling Oaks and Bunche Parks – K&S' landscape architecture division provided grant assistance and planning services for two parks in Miami Gardens. Our designs for the parks included a nature trail, recreation center, maintenance buildings, pavilions, press boxes, a concession/restroom facility, soccer/football fields, tennis courts, a baseball field, a parcourse, volleyball courts, an aquatic play structure, lighting, signage,



parking, and playgrounds. Plans, renderings, and cost estimates were also prepared to assist in grant (Florida Recreation Development Assistant) requirements.

Hillsboro El Rio Park – K&S provided professional landscape architecture, engineering, survey, and environmental services to the City of Boca Raton for the design and site plan approval of a 17-acre park. The park will be built on an abandoned landfill adjacent to a wetland, requiring significant additional permitting and geotechnical involvement. The park features will include entry signage, a grand pavilion and restroom, large and small pavilions with grills, a fitness path, large passive recreation areas, a non-motorized boat launch, sport courts, a large playground, shade structures, and a fitness station. Native plantings will be used to anchor the park features, provide shade and interest, screen the adjacent railway, and buffer the adjacent mangrove wetland. A pedestrian mid-block crossing will connect the north



and south portions of the park on opposite sides of SW 18th Street. The crossing provides a median refuge and utilizes a pedestrian actuated beacon system.



Little Haiti Artificial Turf Conversion - K&S was awarded this contract to develop a site plan to redesign the existing path, existing practice field, and amenities located throughout the soccer park. The goal of the design was to implement a new artificial practice field where an existing turf practice field existed. As a result the existing path needed to be relocated and redesigned. A tree disposition plan and additional proposal of trees have been integrated to increase the shade canopy for park goers. A landscape wall was proposed to enhance the aesthetics and experience for park users. The landscape wall was designed to help retain the existing soil, and slope to reduce the impact of having to mitigate/relocate majority of the existing trees.

Major Arterial Corridor Study: Creating Identity and Sense of Place – The Major Arterial Corridor Study examined the City of Tamarac's four major roadways - Commercial Boulevard, University Drive, McNab Road, and SR-7 - for improvements related to the study's three design initiatives: gateways, streetscapes, and neighborhood buffer walls. K&S performed a full site inventory for fifteen miles of roadway, examining all aspects of each corridor. This was completed in order to develop design recommendations and concepts that would help create a cohesive aesthetic, as well as begin to develop a stronger community identity and sense of place. K&S provided graphic renderings (plans, sections, and perspectives) to help illustrate the



recommended improvements. In addition to the streetscape analysis, the neighborhood buffer wall initiative required an in depth evaluation of 28 residential neighborhoods. An objective, ranking system was formulated to compare attributes of all 28 neighborhoods, providing the City with an ordered list of neighborhoods recommended to receive buffer walls. As part of the study, K&S held a community outreach meeting, surveying the public to gather feedback. In addition, our team worked closely with City Staff to develop a document for the City to use for years to come.



Windmill Park Concept - K&S' involvement in the original plat work for the development of Windmill Park started in 1987 - then called Coco Parc. In 1990, K&S prepared the original design work for the park, providing the City of Coconut Creek with master planning, site design, landscape, irrigation and parking design, construction inspection, administration services, and overall project coordination assistance. The current park includes active and passive recreation areas, bike, jogging, and nature trails, picnic areas, playgrounds, ball fields, court games, entrance and park signage, wetland mitigation lakes, and multi-purpose buildings.

In 2012, K&S worked closely with the City to develop a conceptual plan for park improvements. This plan included such elements as an additional basketball court, expanded landscapes, open play areas, shelters, proposed parking, walking paths, station-based exercise circuit, separated large and small dog parks, and a restroom facility.



Visioning Apopka - The K&S team guided the community-wide Strategic Plan (with Vision and Re-Branding) for the City of Apopka. To create Apopka's strategic vision plan for the future, the K&S team reflected the City's cultural, historical, and demographic diversities. We sought to include as many participants as possible. To gauge residents and other interested parties' desires about opportunities and challenges, a survey was designed and conducted over a series of months to enable optimum response; over 1,200 responses were collected, tabulated, interpreted, and summarized for policy makers. Participants were also able to express their concerns and desires regarding the future of Apopka at any of the three Mobile Information Station (MIS) events, or five community forums that the K&S team facilitated. To

maximize efforts in reaching all members in the project study area, two additional community meetings were held for members of Apopka's African-American and Hispanic communities. For those who needed it, we had K&S staff translating the forum, project information, and graphic boards into Spanish. Additionally, the team created and, to this day, maintains a project website that displays up-to-date information regarding the project's progress.

Plantation Midtown District 2023: An Update of the Conceptual Master Plan - A multi-disciplinary project team with urban planning, economics, and traffic design expertise was engaged for a limited scope of a six month schedule to update the master plan for Plantation's Midtown District. The prior 2002-2016 Plan presented a conceptual master plan for the approximately 1-1/3 square mile area that was also assembled by K&S. The Plan Update is consistent with Midtown District's 1988 Charter for Safe Neighborhood Improvement District as it furthers the pursuit of maintaining a vibrant, livable, and safe community.



The Update's focus was to present a conceptual guide for desired future development based on current input and the prior plan in context with existing conditions, including a market study, and economic and fiscal analyses. Methods used included a combination of field observations, examination of land use trends, consultation with staff and developers about "pipeline" projects, comparison with other areas of Broward County, and application of local and professional knowledge.



Conceptual Design Master Plan for the Proposed NW 7th Avenue Chinatown Cultural Arts and Innovation District - The City of North Miami identified the opportunity to buildup on the existing multicultural context and spirit of entrepreneurship along the NW 7th Avenue Corridor.

Our goals in connection with this project were to promote the transformation of NW 7th Avenue:

- From a commercial corridor to a vibrant mixed-use employment urban district.
- From auto-centric corridor to multi-modal mobility.
- From an eclectic collection of different buildings to a more balanced, unique and attractive destination branded as Chinatown.

The Master Plan provides a new type of development based on traditional urbanism principles that can cater to new markets: immigrants of Chinese and other multi-cultural and ethnic backgrounds, millennial professionals, singles and families, and aging baby boomers. Attractive and financially adequate mixed-use, flexible building types for business and housing are a special focus. The K&S team designed quality urbanism supported by the proper Land Development Code to create a beautiful walkable urbanism that creates value in both short and long term.

The K&S team studied the existing conditions in North Miami, as well as in other high quality places throughout south Florida. We identified that historically there is a walkable block network, adjacency of different building types and uses, forming a fine-grain urbanism. These principles formed the foundation for design guidelines that promote the implementation of Chinatown vision and are also flexible and adaptable. These specific Design Guidelines can ensure predictability for investors, developers, and community. Our team also studied the connectivity to the university campus, adjacent communities, workplace, and transit nodes. The Master Plan promotes connectivity internally at the micro-scale, as well as at the regional, macro-scale.

Our scope of work included an innovated public participation process. We engaged in a series of Community Forums as part of the public-private engagement process.



WILLINGNESS TO MEET TIME AND BUDGET

The K&S team is structured to overlap and interconnect the different disciplines anticipated under this contract. 










The K&S team has earned a reputation for tailoring our work program to our clients and their individual goals. The City's Cemetery Master Plan is an excellent opportunity for our firm to employ our proven model of landscape architecture, historic preservation, and civil engineering combined with professional master planning principles.

We understand that there is a sentimental human connection to these City properties. K&S will approach our work in a manner that is inclusive and sensitive to those who visit and value these sites. **Due to limited resources associated with perpetual care, K&S will approach this project and make recommendations that are cost-effective and sustainable.**

K&S has a long history of involvement with the Fort Lauderdale cemeteries. In 2002, we worked closely with the City and community to create and implement improvements to the *Historic Woodlawn Cemetery*. The challenge for the K&S team was to respect the existing gravesites and cultural landscape. This required intimate site analysis, as well as a responsibility and sensitivity toward the layers of history, much of it unrecorded. This meant the irrigation piping and head layout was designed in response to these conditions. Even the valve boxes were customized to mimic the pattern and profile of a grave marker. The team worked closely with the historical society to ensure all known names were included on the new monuments. The result is a composition of functional walkways and resting areas with a series of story-telling memorials. These were created with custom detailing of colored concrete, split-face concrete block, black granite, and stainless steel markers that have become synonymous with the site today. Other improvements included welded metal picket fencing, custom cast steel signage, benches, and trash receptacles. Each have been incorporated into a design concept that accommodates and preserves the historic elements of the site. Opening day was successful, with the project lauded by the local paper and attended by local citizens, preachers, and politicians.

The City now desires to document the historic context and existing conditions, including the natural environment of each of its municipal cemeteries. Following these assessments, recommendations regarding the maintenance and development of these sites are required. In order to accomplish this, **K&S will work with the Cemetery Board of Trustees to gather input and create a vision.**



KEY PERSONNEL, PROPOSED METHODOLOGY, PROJECT GOALS, ANTICIPATED OUTCOMES, AND TIMEFRAME

Our team will be led by *Chris Miller, RLA, ISA, LEED AP, SITE AP, LIAF, FNGLA, IA.* Mr. Miller serves as our Assistant Director of Landscape Architecture, and has been a project manager on numerous City projects. This project will be a team effort within our multi-disciplinary firm.

Our planning department under the leadership of Director, *Heidi Siegel, AICP*, will provide the historical and cultural context for the project. Ms. Siegel holds a master's degree in Historic Preservation Planning, and has been involved in municipal government operations for the past 18 years. Ms. Siegel will also guide the team on long-term strategies and the implementation plan to make sure it is aligned with City operations.

As asset to our team, *Bradley Benmoshé*, *LEED Green Associate*, *CPTED*, has extensive experience with cemetery research. He recently used the historic Evergreen Cemetery as a case study for a journal article he is submitting to the Journal for Sustainable Development. Having researched and visited more than 20 cemeteries around the world, he has intimate knowledge of cemetery layouts, operations, and maintenance issues. Furthermore, he has created conceptual designs of innovative and sustainable cemeteries.



Our multi-disciplinary team will approach this project as follows:



Cemetery Board of Trustees Coordination: The K&S planning team, using proven facilitation techniques, will meet with the Board of Trustees to solicit input and guidance on the short-term and long-term vision of the cemeteries.

Goal: Community Outreach and Input

Anticipated

Outcome: Ensure that Master Plan is aligned with the Board of Trustees vision.

Timeframe: Ongoing



Documentation of Historic and Cultural Context: Led by K&S Planning Director, and historic preservationist, Heidi Siegel, AICP, our team will analyze and provide an overview of the historic and cultural significance of each site. This will include research of local archives and resources, oral interviews, site research and documentation.

Goal: Document all four cemeteries equitably.

Anticipated

Outcome: Using existing data and information, supplemented by new historic

research, our team will provide the City with a thorough history of the

municipal cemeteries.

Timeframe: Month 1



Documentation of Natural Context: Led by K&S Senior Environmental Scientist, Marisa Magrino, ISA, FNGLA, our team will analyze and provide an overview of the natural features of each site. This will include soils, topography, geological features, mapping and flora and fauna.

Goal: Identify significant natural features.

Anticipated

Outcome: Our team will provide a comprehensive document identifying all natural

features within the municipal cemeteries.



Geospatial Database: Our in-house survey team will create a database in ArcGIS 10.5 of all features within the cemeteries. This includes perimeter legal boundaries for all sites, mausoleums, buildings and facilities, above ground infrastructure, irrigation lines and equipment, and roadways and paths, including the type.

Goal: Create a comprehensive database of assets and features within the

municipal cemeteries.

Anticipated

Outcome: Deliver a set of ArcGIS Version 10 compatible databases, including

geodatabases and ASCII text files.

Timeframe: Month 1-2



Asset Condition and Assessment: Our architecture team, led by Tamara Peacock, RA, shall provide a methodology for assessing gravesites, and provide an overall conditions assessment using representative examples of grave typologies (style and material) and representative conditions. This will focus on conditions that present a safety hazard.

The K&S landscape architecture team, led by Chris Miller, RLA, will evaluate the condition, efficacy, and appropriateness of all fences and gateways in each of the four cemeteries. He shall make recommendations for repair and/or replacement.

The K&S landscape architecture team will also evaluate the turf conditions and maintenance practices. By interviewing maintenance staff, we will identify areas for improvements, remove harmful or wasteful practices, and guide the resources in the most efficient manner.

Our irrigation designers, also led by Mr. Miller, will assess the existing irrigation systems and existing equipment. Both Mr. Miller, and landscape architect Todd Mohler, RLA, ISA, IA, are certified irrigation designers and auditors that stay current with the Irrigation Best Management Practices (BMPs). Their knowledge will give the City the best insight on what needs to be changed or replaced to reduce consumption and keep the system running as efficient as possible.

The K&S landscape architecture team will also evaluate the cemetery circulation and the conditions of the sidewalk and pathways. Weather it is concrete, pavers, or bonded aggregate, our team will be able give a thorough evaluation, particularly where damage may be coming from tree roots. Our team has many innovative recommendations that have been successfully used in urban tree environments. These include sidewalks ramping over existing trees, so that both trees and sidewalks can coexist and function as intended.

Led by Jake Ozyman, P.E., ENV SP, and our civil team, K&S will evaluate road material, width, and curbing. We will then make recommendations to improve access, as well as prevent threats to grave sites that are adjacent to roads.

The K&S civil team will also identify areas of persistent flood, and areas where storm water poses a threat to cemetery assets. The team will determine if professional engineering services are required, and will prioritize service needs in the Implementation Guide. For example, we offer a service that includes summarizing risks of failure of existing drainage infrastructure with respect to gravesites.

Goal: Assessment of the conditions of the municipal cemetery assets.

Anticipated

Outcome: Fully documented condition assessment.

Timeframe: Month 1-2



Site Analysis & Plan: Our civil and planning teams will provide recommendations to increase operational efficiency through alterations in the siting of maintenance and spoils storage areas. Our team shall examine existing and potential nodes for pedestrian-related amenities.

Led by the K&S planning division, our team will provide recommendations to increase operational efficiency public access and asset protection. This will occur through changes to pedestrian and vehicular circulation, parking, as well as addressing ADA accessibility issues.

The K&S urban design team, led by Brad Benmoshé, LEED Green Associate, CPTED, will provide recommendations for the development of cemetery informational and directional signage. This includes wayfinding and marking of cemetery sections. Our team will identify opportunities for visitor kiosks that provide cemetery historical information and maps.

Our CPTED team, led by Kevin Johnson II, CPTED, will determine the major threats to cemetery security, as well as identify strategies for the reduction of crime, vandalism and theft. Furthermore, our team will address theft and security issues with regard to historic iron fencing and other funerary items.

TASK 07

Preservation & Conservation: Led by Tamara Peacock, RA, our team will provide recommendations for conservation of gravestones and plot coverings. We will also identify appropriate and accessible methods of restoration and repair of existing markers, such as installing and/or replacing markers. Our recommendations will guide the use of herbicides and pesticides in a manner to prevent further damage to monuments and gravestones. Additional recommendations will include the resetting of gravestones and monuments, repairing fencing and plot curbing, and maintenance of monuments and commemorative features. Within our Implementation Plan, we will ensure proper assessments of existing cemetery building conditions and building restoration prioritization.

Our team also includes MBR construction, Inc., which has performed construction services to cemeteries in the past. The contractor will be able to assist in recommending best practices to restore damaged or leaning monuments, with the care and respect needed in this setting. They will also determine what type of equipment may be needed, and what equipment is feasible to use without disturbing the existing features.

Goal: Provide a plan to restore damaged grave markers to their original

state.

Anticipated

Outcome: Our historic architect will provide a full report on how to proceed with

restoration within the municipal cemeteries.



Policy & Funding: Led by K&S Director of Planning, Heidi Siegel, AICP, our team will determine if the cemeteries and/or features within them may be eligible for local, state, or federal designation. We will also identify potential designations, and explain the benefits of each designation.

Led by K&S Registered Landscape Architect, Chris Miller, RLA, our team will identify and make recommendations regarding existing studies and reports on the stability and viability of the Perpetual Care Trust Fund. This will result in a determination of the perpetual care requirement for each of the four cemeteries. We shall conclude if current funding levels are adequate to meet the expected standards of care in perpetuity.

Cemetery and Sea Level Rise: Led by K&S Director of Civil Engineering, Jake Ozyman, P.E., ENV SP, our team will provide recommendations on the impacts of surface water inundation, and a rising groundwater table. The plan will include, at a minimum: an analysis of low lying areas in each cemetery, as well as a review of current best practices for cemeteries experiencing high ground-water tables. It will be followed by recommendations on areas to prohibit future interment due to elevation, and conclude with a discussion of long term planning for grave sites that may become permanently inundated.

Goal: Minimize effects to the cemeteries due to sea level rise.

Anticipated

Outcome: Develop the master plan to identify grave sites in areas of each

cemetery least likely to be affected by sea level rise.

TASK 10

Cemetery Development and Expansion: Led by K&S Director of Planning, Heidi Siegel, AICP, our team will perform an analysis of the existing capacity, and identify opportunities for greater use of cemetery space at Lauderdale Memorial Park Cemetery, Sunset Memorial Gardens Cemetery and Evergreen Cemetery. We will address the City's desire to plat additional plots within cemetery boundaries. Ms. Siegel will also lead the team to successfully perform the following tasks: project revenue potential with regard to new programs, current inventory, increase inventory, and market adjustment rates. We will also explore the installation of columbarium facilities, cremains gardens, family estate burials, and other types of burial options at cemeteries where appropriate; providing conceptual plans for possible locations, probable cost estimates for installation, and a probable revenue estimate for sales of columbarium spaces;. Finally, we will provide recommendations regarding the appropriateness and process of new monuments or commemorative features in each cemetery.

The K&S landscape architecture team, led by Chris Miller, RLA, will provide general recommendations and best practices for the future design of cemetery irrigation systems. We will provide a probable cost estimate, and prioritize in the Implementation Guide. These efforts will improve the aesthetic of the municipal cemeteries.

K&S will incorporate urban design principles within the landscape plan, as well as the site furnishing plan. These principles will be unique to the City and each individual site. The plans will reflect the neighborhoods that surround each site.

Goal: Efficiently plan and develop the cemeteries to ensure future

expansion.

Anticipated

Outcome: Creatively plan and develop each cemetery.

Timeframe: Month 5-6

TASK 11

Implementation Guide: Led by K&S Registered Landscape Architect Chris Miller, RLA, our team will provide an implementation guide with recommendations for the rehabilitation, preservation, maintenance, financial solvency, and expansion of the cemeteries.

Goal: Encourage cultural tourism program

Anticipated

Outcome: Identify the requirements for local, state, and federal historic

designation, create signage program and information kiosks.

LONG-RANGE VISION FOR THE FORT LAUDERDALE CEMETERY SYSTEM







K&S believes there is an opportunity to introduce greenspace that connects the existing cemeteries into the surrounding neighborhoods. For example, during a recent site visit, bicyclists, pedestrians, and joggers were observed in the Lauderdale Memorial Park Cemetery. Additionally, pedestrians were observed in the Historic Evergreen Cemetery. Within the Woodlawn Cemetery there is the possibility for better circulation. The existing walkway does not connect to itself, and creates a less appealing user experience.

Each sites possesses an opportunity to augment the previous plaque program that was part of the foregoing K&S scope of work at the Woodlawn Cemetery.

We believe the City should consider making all cemeteries more sustainable through careful analysis of natural conditions, and emerging burial trends. We look forward to receiving direction from the Cemetery Board of Trustees on their vision.

As outlined above, K&S is confident that we can create an action plan that is specific to the conditions of each of the four individual sites. For example, some of the grave markers at Woodlawn Cemetery appear to have used non-conventional methods for lettering. *Our recommendations will consider these historic conditions*.

Maintenance and Operations Standards and Guidelines

Maintenance, preservation, and rehabilitation are all factors of our practice in evaluating life cycle cost of materials and systems. Similar to our design practices, K&S interviews the maintenance staff and managers. We want to fully understand maintenance capabilities, and prioritize maintenance concerns. This process assesses where excessive resources and funds are being utilized, and allows the team to recommend more sustainable solutions. The processes analyze and evaluate the purpose, effect, and initial and maintenance cost. In rehabilitating site elements and expansions, the evaluation processes includes similar procedures. They factor in changes of design, materials, and phasing. **As K&S has a complete team of landscape architects, engineers, preservation planners, and cost contractor, our recommendations for preservation, maintenance, and rehabilitation for each existing facility will be highly sustainable, attractive, functional, and historically balanced**.

K&S has completed maintenance manuals that included a mobile version for field staff. The mobile version is a bi-lingual graphic version of the manual, providing examples of proper maintenance practice tailored to each specific site.

This is an advantage to the City, in that it saves time and money throughout the project. We are familiar with the City and sites, and will not depend on the City to hold our hand during this process.






