TITLE: Quasi – Judicial Resolution Granting a Waiver of Limitations at 826 NE 20th

Avenue for the Installation of One (1) Wood Finger Pier and Two (2) Double

Mooring Pile Clusters

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission adopt a Resolution granting a Waiver of Limitations for the installation of one (1) wood finger pier and two (2) double mooring pile clusters.

Background

The applicant is seeking a resolution granting a Waiver of Limitations (a waiver to allow mooring structures to extend beyond the maximum distance as defined by City Code) of Section 47-19.3 (C) & (D) of the Unified Land Development Regulations (ULDR) for the installation of one (1) wood finger pier and two (2) double mooring pile clusters extending a maximum distance of +/- 68'5" from the property line into the Middle River.

Although there is not a fee associated with obtaining a Waiver of Limitations, an application fee in the amount of \$300.00 is required. The summary description specifies that the additional distance for the finger piers and piling clusters are necessary to safely moor resident's vessels, as this is along a high traffic waterway, especially during high wind and severe weather.

The MAB recommended approval of the application 12 to 0 (see Exhibit 3).

Resource Impact

There is a positive fiscal impact in the amount of \$300.
