TITLE: Motion to Approve Increase in Funds to Contract for Special Event Clean-

Up Services – Weed-A-Way, Inc. - \$90,000

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission approve an increase in funds to contract No. 373-11879 for special event clean-up services with Weed-A-Way, Inc. in the amount of \$90,000.

Background

The purpose of this contract is to provide for the collection and hauling of garbage, recyclables and litter resulting from City-sponsored special events and activities.

On February 16, 2017 a two-year contract with two one-year renewal options for special event clean-up services was awarded to Weed-a-Way, Inc. in the annual amount of \$71,524. On April 24, 2017, a change order in the amount of \$25,000 was administratively approved. On June 20, 2017 this contract went before commission to approve an increase in contract value of \$46,524. (CAM 17-0617). The total of the initial award, the administrative change order, and the approval of CAM 17-0617 amounts to \$143,048 for the two-year initial contract term as opposed to the \$71,524 originally requested. The initial contract term ends on February 6, 2019.

Spring Break 2017 saw a significant increase in visitors to the City's beach area, significantly increasing the need for clean-up services. Staff anticipates a similarly well-attended Spring Break season for 2018 with the same requirement for services as the past year. Due to these additional events and services being added to the contract for the upcoming first renewal term, staff is requesting an increase in funding in the amount of \$90,000 to cover anticipated expenses. All rates currently paid to the vendor will follow their awarded bid pricing and those rates will continue throughout the term of the contract. Market analysis was performed to establish the pricing which is still at least 14% lower than a similar sized municipality in south Florida.

Resource Impact

There will be a current fiscal year impact to the City in the amount of \$90,000. Future expenditures are contingent upon appropriation of funds.
