ORDINANCE NO. C-18-12

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF FORT LAUDERDALE, FLORIDA, AMENDING SECTION 26-1, DEFINITIONS OF WORDS AND PHRASES, OF CHAPTER 26, TRAFFIC AND PARKING, OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF FORT LAUDERDALE, FLORIDA, BY AMENDING THE DEFINITION OF "HOLIDAYS," AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, REPEAL OF CONFLICTING ORDINANCE PROVISIONS, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the definition of "Holidays," contained in Section 26-1 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Fort Lauderdale, Florida, requires revision;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF FORT LAUDERDALE, FLORIDA:

<u>SECTION 1</u>. That the definition of "Holidays," contained in Section 26-1 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Fort Lauderdale, Florida, is amended to read as follows:

Holidays, in addition to Sundays where posted on certain meters, means those entire days declared by the city to be legal holidays which City offices are closed. These include: New Year's Day, Martin Luther King, Jr. Day, <u>President's Day</u>, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, <u>Columbus Day</u>, Veterans Day, Thanksgiving Day, the day after Thanksgiving Day, and Christmas Day.

<u>SECTION 2</u>. That if any clause, section, or other part of this Ordinance shall be held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this Ordinance shall not be affected thereby, but shall remain in full force and effect.

<u>SECTION 3</u>. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith, be and the same are hereby repealed.

CODING: Words, symbols, and letters stricken are deletions; words, symbols, and letters underlined are additions. Words, symbols, and letters underlined with a dotted line remain unchanged after first reading.
