**TITLE:** Motion to Reject all Bids for Mills Pond Park Path and Overlook Project

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**Recommendation**

It is recommended that the City Commission reject all bids received on October 25, 2017 in response to Invitation to Bid No. 12035-473.

**Background**

On August 24, 2017, the Procurement Services Division issued Invitation to Bid No. 12035-473 for the construction of the Mills Pond Park Path and Overlook Project. The cost estimate for this project was \$139,665.75. On October 25, 2017, six bid offers for the project were received as follows:

- Graham Contracting LLC .....\$217,500
- Sagaris Corp. ....\$225,700
- Weekley Asphalt Paving, Inc.....\$255,490
- West Construction, Inc. ....\$309,484
- Lambert Bros. Inc.....\$399,210
- Interstate Construction .....\$458,000

Staff recommends all bids be rejected because the project has insufficient funds to award the contract. Staff will re-bid the project after reducing the scope of work without having a significant impact on final functionality, safety and aesthetics of the project.

**Resource Impact**

There is no fiscal impact associated with this action.

**Strategic Connections**

This item is a *Press Play Fort Lauderdale Strategic Plan 2018* initiative, included within the Public Places Cylinder of Excellence, especially advancing:

- Goal 3: Be a community that finds opportunities and leverages partnerships to create unique, inviting and connected gathering places that highlight our beaches, waterways, urban areas, and parks.

- Objective 1: Improve access to and enjoyment of our beach, Riverwalk, waterways, parks, and open spaces for everyone.
