Estimated FY 2019 Non-Ad Valorem Assessment Rate and Authorizing a

Public Hearing on September 12, 2018

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission adopt a preliminary rate resolution setting the Non-Ad Valorem Fire Assessment Fee at \$256 per single family residential dwelling and establish the date of September 12, 2018 at 6:00 PM to hold a public hearing at City Hall 100 North Andrews Avenue to consider public comments.

Background

The City Commission authorized the creation of the Fire Assessment Program to fund the fire services, facilities, and/or programs that will benefit the City in its entirety, such as facility improvements, special equipment, and cost of fire suppression operations on June 15, 1999 (Ordinance C-99-49). Annually, the City establishes an assessment rate to fund continued fire services and operations for the upcoming year.

The City proposes a rate of \$256 per single family residential property, the same rate as last year. For Fiscal Year 2019, the proposed assessment will generate an estimated \$40,016,852 in revenue to the General Fund.

The City Manager is required per Section 197.3632 (5)(a) Florida Statutes to certify the non-ad valorem assessment rate to the Broward County Tax Collector no later than September 15, 2018.

Resource Impact

There is no fiscal impact associated with this action.
