**TITLE**: Special Events Policy Discussion

With the growth of Fort Lauderdale over the last several years, the City has experienced a significant increase in special events held by non-City event organizers and promoters. While the City has enjoyed a renewed activation of our beach and downtown areas, this increase has taken a toll on the City's infrastructure, created traffic congestion, and placed a heavy burden on our resources. In addition, the Commission has expressed an interest in charging fees for organizers using our beach. As such, staff desires to revise the City's current ordinance and special events process to address the increased impact and accommodate the interest in increased fees.

Staff would like to discuss elements of the City's special event policy with the Commission to obtain direction on moving forward with our program. The elements presented for discussion consist of

- > Better defining what qualifies as a special event
- > A more manageable application deadline
- > Fees
- Enforcement of Permit Compliance
- > Establishing Special Event Limitation with regards to location, event type, and quantity of events
