

On January 22, 2018, the Applicant held the Public Participation Meeting for the Progresso Commons Site Plan. Email notification of the meeting was sent to the Ron Centemore, President of the Progresso Village Civic Association and Terry Nolen, President of the South Middle River Civic Association, notification attached hereto as Exhibit 1. The meeting attendance sheet is attached as Exhibit 2. The project graphics presented are attached as Composite Exhibit 3. Changes to the layout of the site since the project was last presented to these association were discussed and the relocation of the Wawa to the corner of the site and reorientation of the gas pumps was well received. The only issue raised by the associations was lighting within the site and along adjacent public rights of way. Mr. Centemore requested that the Applicant incorporate neighborhood approved street lights to the extent permitted by the applicable regulatory agencies; the Applicant agreed to work with City staff to evaluate how best to incorporate that street lighting. The Associations also requested that the Applicant send them a copy of the project photometric plan and if requested, meet with Association representatives to explain that plan. The project photometric plan was sent to the Association representatives on February 16, 2018 (see attached Exhibit 4).

- The applicant shall conduct a public participation meeting(s) a minimum of 30 days prior to the PZB hearing.
- After the public participation meeting(s), the applicant shall provide a written report letter to the Department of Sustainable Development, with copy to subject association(s), documenting the date(s), time(s), location(s), number of participants, presentation material and general summary of the discussion after a public participation meeting(s) has taken place a minimum of 30 days prior to the PZB hearing. The report letter shall summarize the substance of comments expressed during the process and shall be made a part of the administrative case file record.
