TITLE: Motion to Approve Increase in Funds to the Construction Engineering

Inspection Services Continuing Contract - Various Consultants -

\$1,405,000

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission approve an increase in funds to the Construction Engineering Inspection (CEI) Services continuing contract (RFQ #466-11730) with R.J. Behar & Company, Inc., Michael Baker International, Inc., Wood Environment & Infrastructure Solutions, Inc., Craven Thompson & Associates, Inc. and Calvin Giordano & Associates, Inc. in the amount of \$1,405,000.

Background

On February 7, 2017, the City Commission approved the contract award for CEI services with an original approved funding amount of \$1,484,000 (CAM #17-0103). The initial contract is for a two-year term with two one-year renewal options. To date, seven task orders have been issued with a combined value of \$1,036,057. The remaining allocated funding of \$447,943 is not sufficient to provide the CEI services required for upcoming projects. When these contracts renew on February 7, 2019, an additional funding amount of \$742,000 will be allocated for the first renewal (half of the original two-year funding amount). The remaining allocated funding balance and future funding has been taken into consideration in determining the additional funding allocation increase. This contract provides CEI services authorized by individual task orders for individual projects. These contracts are used to advance many important initiatives and projects.

This funding allocation increase is necessary to provide CEI services for additional projects identified by staff; these projects include, but are not limited to, the following:

Croissant Park - Small Water Mains

Victoria Park A – North Small Water Mains

Victoria Park B – South Small Water Mains

Bermuda Riviera - Small Water Mains

Bayshore Drive - Force Main Intracoastal Crossing

Resource Impact

There will be a fiscal impact to the City in the estimated amount \$1,405,000. Funds in the amount of \$1,405,000 are available in the FY 2018 accounts listed below.
