**TITLE**: Motion to Approve Assumption of Contract and Consent to Assignment for

Wastewater Conveyance System Long-Term Rehabilitation Program to

Granite Inliner, LLC

### Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission approve an Assumption of Contract and Consent to Assignment, in substantially the form attached, for wastewater conveyance system long-term rehabilitation program from Layne Inliner, LLC (Layne) to Granite Inliner, LLC (Granite).

## **Background**

On January 18, 2017 the City Commission approved contract no. 466-11799 for wastewater conveyance system long-term rehabilitation with Miller Pipeline, LLC, Insituform Technologies, LLC, LMK Pipe Renewal, LLC, Lanzo Trenchless Technologies, Inc. – South, and Layne in the not-to-exceed amount of \$15,000,000 for the two-year term (CAM 17-0054).

Layne has been acquired by Granite and has assigned the above referenced contract, in its entirety, to Granite. Granite shall perform Layne's duties, obligations, and responsibilities under the original contract.

#### Resource Impact
