TITLE: Motion to Accept a Grant of up to \$221,107 from the Florida Inland Navigation District (FIND) for Phase II Construction of the Coontie Hatchee Lagoon (BR-FL-18-132)

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission approve the acceptance of a Grant award from the Florida Inland Navigation District (FIND) of up to \$221,107 for Phase II Construction of the Coontie Hatchee Lagoon. This Grant requires a City match of \$221,107.

Background

The Florida Inland Navigation District (FIND) administers the Waterway Assistance Program (WAP) program. FIND provides funding assistance to local governments within the District to provide public access to the waterways.

The Coontie Hatchie Park is located on the New River. At this time there is no waterway access to and from the park. The community reached out to the City requesting access to the river through the park via a lagoon with a beach. The City Commission accepted a grant from FIND at its January 5, 2016 for Phase I design and permitting. Design is complete and permits have been issued.

District funding is made available after October 1 of each year. The project is anticipated to cost approximately \$517,391 which includes \$442,214 for construction and \$75,177 for internal city project management costs, which are ineligible for grant funding. The FIND grant will provide \$221,107 of funding for the project.

Resource Impact

The total project cost is \$517,391. There is a positive fiscal impact to the City in the amount of \$221,107 related to the grant funding. There is a negative fiscal cash match impact to the City in the amount of \$296,284. The cash match is being funded by Park Impact Fees.. Funds are being appropriated contingent upon the approval of the Consolidated Budget Amendment CAM 18-1169.
