TITLE: Motion Accepting Extension of the FY2015 Florida Department of Juvenile

Justice Grant in the Amount of \$27,777

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission approve the acceptance of a grant extension in the amount of \$27,777 from the Florida Department of Juvenile Justice (FDJJ).

Background

In January 2015, the City submitted an application to the Florida Department of Juvenile Justice in response to a solicitation for proposals from law enforcement agencies to deliver services that address the issue of overrepresentation of minority youth in Florida's juvenile justice system. The City was awarded \$27,777 in grant funding in order to address Disproportionate Minority Contact (DMC) thru the provision of DMC curriculum training, focus groups and DMC analysis reports for the period of September 1, 2015 to August 31, 2016. Pleased with the success of this program as administered by the Fort Lauderdale Police Department, FDJJ has renewed the grant in 2016 and 2017. As the program period comes to an end, FDJJ has again proposed to extend the grant period by another year. They have also increased the grant award by an additional \$27,777 to bring the total contribution to \$111,108. This increase accommodates the provision of the additional DMC trainings, focus groups and analysis reports. The revised grant period is now September 1, 2015 through August 31, 2019.

Resource Impact

There is an anticipated positive fiscal impact to the City in the amount of \$27,777. The grant does not require matching funds. This item is contingent upon the approval of the Consolidated Budget Amendment CAM 18-1169.
