2.01 - Description of Corportate Limits, et al.	"The following area shall constitute the corporate limits of the City of Fort Lauderdale: ..."	<p style="text-align: center;"><b><i>City Corporate Limits</i></b></p> <p>Ensure that the City's legal boundaries are accurate and up to date; review is in progress.</p>
3.03 - Qualification of members; forfeiture of office, et al.	To be eligible to hold the office of city commissioner of the City of Fort Lauderdale, or to qualify for nomination or election as such, the candidate shall have resided in the City of Fort Lauderdale for six (6) months immediately preceding the date of the election, and shall reside in the commission district from which he <u>or she</u> seeks election ...	<p style="text-align: center;"><b><i>Gender Neutrality</i></b></p> <p>Replace all "he" and "his" references with "he or she", "his or her", "the individual", "the person", or other gender neutral references throughout the document.</p>
3.12 - Special meetings—How called.	The mayor, <del>any two (2) members of the city commission, vice-mayor,</del> or the city manager, may call special meetings of the city commission upon at least six (6) hours' written <u>or e-mail</u> notice to each member, the city manager, <u>city auditor</u> , city clerk, <u>and city attorney and chief of police</u> , served personally, <u>transmitted by e-mail</u> , or left at his <u>or her</u> usual place of residence. The call notice shall state the general purpose of the meeting....	<p style="text-align: center;"><b><i>Special Called Meetings</i></b></p> <p>Clarify who can call a meeting in that "any two (2) members of the city commission" may violate the State's Sunshine Law. Add City Auditor to those receiving notice and provide for electronic notice of special meeting.</p>
4.02 - Compensation of officers and employees.	...The city commission shall by resolution fix the compensation of the city manager, <u>the city auditor</u> , <u>the city clerk</u> and the city attorney. All other officers and employees shall receive the compensation designated under the pay plan and rules and regulations of the civil service system or the applicable collective bargaining agreement.	<p style="text-align: center;"><b><i>Compensation of Charter Officers</i></b></p> <p>Add City Auditor and City Clerk to those officers whose salaries are set by resolution of the City Commission.</p>

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4.04 - Functions and duties of mayor-commissioner, et al.	The mayor-commissioner or, in his absence or disqualification, the vice-mayor <del>or mayor pro tem, as the case may be,</del> shall perform the following functions:	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Mayor Pro Tem</b></p> <p>Eliminate "mayor pro tem" reference.</p>
4.13 (a) - City clerk.	The city commission shall appoint a city clerk who shall be under the direction and supervision of the city commission and who shall hold office at the pleasure of the city commission.
