TITLE:	Motion to Accept FY2017 Edward Byrne Justice Assistance Grant – Local Solicitation – \$97,396

## Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission approve the acceptance of a grant in the amount of \$97,396 from the U.S. Department of Justice.

## Background

The City has been awarded a grant in the amount of \$97,396 from the U.S. Department of Justice under the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (Byrne/JAG) Local Solicitation Program. The State receives these funds from the Department of Justice and then pass these funds through to units of local government. The Broward Sheriff's Office (BSO) manages the FY 2017 Byrne/JAG allocations for all cities in Broward County. Justice Assistance Grant funding can be used for any local law enforcement initiative, and the City is permitted to use its discretion in deciding which projects to fund.

The Fort Lauderdale Police Department is eligible to receive \$97,396 in Byrne/JAG funding, less a 8.62% administrative fee of \$8,395.54 imposed by BSO, for a total actual award of \$89,000.46. The Police Department has allocated this JAG funding to support investigative and public safety capabilities thru the purchase of investigative and traffic control equipment as well as provision of outreach services. The grant period is October 1, 2016 through September 30, 2020.

## Resource Impact

There is an anticipated positive fiscal impact to the City in the amount of \$89,000.46. The grant does not require matching funds.
