Immediate Recommended Changes

Item	Limitation	Revision
No Parking Areas	No Immediate Impoundment	Allow for immediate impoundment
Corral Areas	No Immediate Impoundment	Allow for immediate impoundment
General Notice to Relocate	2 to 12 hour window	Reduce to 30 minutes, 7 days per week, 7AM to 11:30PM
Impoundment Fees	Low	Increase based on actual staffing and storage cost

Revised Permit Process

- Current: Four permits issued first come, first serve
- Possible: Competitive process (RFP, RFN) for single operator
- Benefits:
 - Fewer operators, fewer devices
 - Better fleet management
 - Enhanced "ownership"
 - Most qualified company







Major Ordinance Refresh C

Increase Fees

- Fund active management
 - Dedicated "emerging mobility" staff to receive, review, and respond to complaints
 - High-visibility compliance campaigns
 - Installation of defined corral areas for parking
 - Public education outreach events and materials

ORDINANCE NO. C-18-16

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DIVISION 2. -DOCKLESS MOBILITY PROGRAMS

Sec. 24-261. - Purpose.

- (a) The purpose of this division is to:
- (1) Permit and regulate Dockless Mobility Programs in the City of Fort Lauderdale.

Sec. 27-262. - Applicability

The provisions of this division shall apply to <u>Dockless</u> Mobility Programs. For the <u>purpose</u> of this division, the applicant, managing agent or operator, and owner shall be jointly and severally liable for complying with the provisions of this division, the permit, and the permit and license agreement.

Sec. 27-263. Definitions.

For the purpose of this division, the following words shall have the meanings indicated:

Application Programming Interface (API) means a set of commands, function, protocols and objects that computer programmers use to create software

Bicycle Rack means a stationary fixture to which a bicycle can be securely attached to prevent theft.

Bike Corral means bicycle parking facilities that can accommodate a group of bicyclesdockless mobility unitstypically installed on-street in lieu of a single vehicle parking space

City Manager means the City Manager of the City of Fort Lauderdale

City-owned property means property owned, occupied, managed, maintained, or controlled by the city pursuant to deed, easement, lease, license, or dedication, and includes city park land and any other property owned by or under the control of the city. When city-owned property is identified for use for a bicycle-sharing facility, it shall be considered an ancillary ROW area subject to city right-of-way standards and regulations and under the jurisdiction of the city engineer.

Customer or User means the individual who rents or uses a Dockless Bicycle or Scooter


