**TITLE**: Resolution to Approve a Highway Maintenance Memorandum of

Agreement for Riverland Road

#### Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission adopt a resolution approving a Highway Maintenance Memorandum of Agreement (HMMOA) for Riverland Road from south of SW 21<sup>st</sup> Street to SW 35<sup>th</sup> Avenue with Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) and authorize the City Manager to execute such agreement.

## **Background**

In 2016, the Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) was awarded an \$11.4 million Transportation Investment Generating Economic Recovery (TIGER) grant for five roadway projects in Fort Lauderdale, Oakland Park, Pompano Beach and Lauderdale Lakes. The Fort Lauderdale project includes roadway improvements on Riverland Road from State Road 7 to Broward Boulevard, and on NW 31<sup>st</sup> Avenue between Commercial Boulevard and McNab Road. The scope of the Riverland Road project includes two tenfoot travel lanes, four-foot bike lanes in each direction with a one-foot buffer and improved five-foot sidewalks where they are missing. FDOT is serving as the project manager for the MPO on the implementation of these projects.

The City of Fort Lauderdale currently has jurisdiction over Riverland Road from south of SW 21<sup>st</sup> Street to Flamingo Lane. The HMMOA includes provisions allowing FDOT to construct certain improvements which involve the widening, milling and resurfacing of Riverland Road from south of SW 21<sup>st</sup> Street to SW 35<sup>th</sup> Avenue within the City right of way, on the City's behalf. The City agrees to maintain the roadway following the completion of the construction improvement project.

A meeting was held with the neighborhood on November 13, 2018 to review the conceptual cross-sections and share updated project information.

The estimated annual maintenance cost for the City is \$16,464 with an additional \$5,000 for striping/signage.

## **Resource Impact**

Subject to future appropriation, the City's estimated contribution will be \$21,464 for annual maintenance costs and striping/signage, beginning in fiscal year 2024.
