TITLE: Resolution Approving an Application for a Dock Permit for Usage of Public Property by Neal R. Kalis as Trustee of the 1700 Brickell Land Trust located at 1700 Brickell Drive

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission adopt a Resolution granting a dock permit for use by private persons of public property for Neal R. Kalis as Trustee of the 1700 Brickell Land Trust located at 1700 Brickell Drive, Fort Lauderdale, FL.

Background

The applicant is seeking a resolution granting a dock permit for use by private persons of public property in accordance with Section 8-144, Fort Lauderdale Code of Ordinances (Exhibit 2) for the use, maintenance and repair of an existing marginal dock within close proximity to 1700 Brickell Drive. Although there is not a fee associated with obtaining a permit for usage by private persons of public property, an application fee in the amount of \$300.00 is required.

The Marine Advisory Board recommended unanimous approval of the application (see Exhibit 3).

Resource Impact

There is a positive fiscal impact in the amount of \$300.
