TITLE: Resolution Granting a Waiver of Limitations at 797 Middle River Drive for
the Installation of a Four-post Boat Lift and Finger Pier

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission adopt a Resolution granting a Waiver of Limitations for the installation of a four-post boat lift and finger pier located at 797 Middle River Drive.

Background

The applicant is seeking a resolution granting a Waiver of Limitations (a waiver to allow mooring structures to extend beyond the maximum distance as defined by City Code) of Section 47-19.3 (C) of the Unified Land Development Regulations (ULDR) for the installation of a four-post boat lift and associated 225 square foot finger pier extending a maximum distance of +/- 54.5 feet from the property line into the Middle River.

Although there is not a fee associated with obtaining a Waiver of Limitations, an application fee in the amount of \$300.00 is required.

The summary description specifies that the additional distance for the boat lift and associated finger pier are necessary to safely moor resident's vessel along this high traffic waterway, especially during high winds and severe weather. The Marine Advisory Board recommended unanimous approval of the application (see Exhibit 3).
