TITLE: Discussion on Hurricane Irma Grant Reimbursement (Districts 1, 2, 3 and 4)

The Federal Emergency Management Agency ("FEMA") established the deadline of March 21, 2019 for all government agencies impacted by Hurricane Irma to submit all projects for grant reimbursement under the Federal Statutes and administrative rules.

The projects will be funded by FEMA (75%), the State (12.5%) and the City (12.5%). However, certain projects may receive up to 100% reimbursement. The City has budgeted \$5,313,763 of match funding for the City's portion of the expenditures.
