TITLE: Motion to Approve Contract for Proprietary Purchase of Recyclable
Materials Processing – Waste Management Inc. of Florida – \$1,200,000
(estimated two-year total) – **(Districts 1, 2, 3 and 4)**

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission approve a contract, in substantially the form attached, for the proprietary purchase of recyclable materials processing from Waste Management Inc. of Florida ("WM") for the two-year estimated amount of \$1,200,000 and authorize the City Manager to approve two, one-year renewal options contingent upon appropriation of funds.

Background

On July 2, 2013, the City of Fort Lauderdale ended its long-term contractual relationship with Broward County under an Interlocal Agreement ("ILA") dated November 25, 1985 for garbage disposal and recyclable materials processing. While the City was able to enter into a new ILA with Broward County effective July 3, 2013 for garbage disposal, municipalities were required to procure recyclable materials processing separately. On July 2, 2013, the City Commission approved a piggyback of the City of Deerfield Beach Contract 2012-13/22 using Sun-Bergeron for recyclable materials processing services. This contract expired on June 30, 2018, as the vendor was not agreeable to renewing the contract.

Several Broward County municipalities including the City of Deerfield Beach, the City of Margate and the City of Sunrise issued solicitations to replace expiring agreements but were unsuccessful because they did not receive any bids/proposals. The City of Sunrise was able to negotiate a contract with WM, upon which most municipalities in Broward County have piggybacked.

Upon further review by Procurement Services, staff confirmed this as a proprietary purchase for recycling processing services through WM as a sole source provider.

Pursuant to Section 2-181(f)(3), Code of Ordinances of the City of Fort Lauderdale, Florida, the City may purchase proprietary items, as defined in Section 2-173, without competitive solicitation. As defined by the Code, a proprietary item is not readily available from more than one supplier, manufacturer, or person and is unique in nature,

without competitive solicitation.

Resource Impact

There will be a current year fiscal impact to the City in the amount of \$373,925. Funding for this purchase in the amount of \$373,925 is available in the FY 2019 Operating Budget in the accounts below listed. Future expenditures are contingent upon approval of annual operating budgets.

The available balance in the Recycling program will increase from \$197,552 to a total of \$409,404, pending the approval and posting of a Budget Transfer to administratively move funds from other sanitation programs.
