TITLE: Resolution Approving an Application for a Dock Permit for Usage of
Public Property by James D. Wilson located at 333 Poinciana Drive –
(Commission District 2)

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission adopt a resolution granting a Dock Permit for use by a private person, James D. Wilson, for the public property located at 333 Poinciana Drive.

Background

At the April 16, 2019 City Commission Regular Meeting, the applicant requested a deferral to May 7, 2019 for this Dock Permit application to provide the applicant's neighbors with additional time for review. At the May 7, 2019 City Commission Regular Meeting, an additional deferral to May 21, 2019 was requested by the District Commissioner to allow additional neighbor concerns to be addressed. The applicant is seeking a resolution granting a Dock Permit for use by a private person of public property in accordance with Section 8-144 of the Fort Lauderdale Code of Ordinances (Exhibit 2) for the use, maintenance and repair of a proposed L-shaped dock adjacent to 333 Poinciana Drive. The Marine Advisory Board unanimously recommended the approval of the application 9 - 0 (Exhibit 3).

Although there is not a fee associated with obtaining a permit for usage by a private person of public property, an application fee in the amount of \$300.00 is required.

Resource Impact

There is a positive fiscal impact in the amount of \$300.00.
