**TITLE:** Motion Authorizing the Execution of a Revocable License Agreement with Broward County for Non-Exclusive Access and Use of Broward County Right-Of-Way for Installation and Maintenance of Hardscape and Landscape Improvements on Andrews Avenue at its intersection with NE 1<sup>st</sup> Street and on NE 3<sup>rd</sup> Avenue at its intersection with NE 1<sup>st</sup> Street –  
**(Commission District 2)**

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**Recommendation**

It is recommended that the City Commission approve a motion to authorize the execution of a Revocable License Agreement with Broward County (Exhibit 1) for Non-Exclusive Access and Use of Broward County Right-Of-Way for Installation and Maintenance of Hardscape and Landscape Improvements on Andrews Avenue at its intersection with NE 1<sup>st</sup> Street and on NE 3<sup>rd</sup> Avenue at its intersection with NE 1<sup>st</sup> Street.

**Background**

Andrews Avenue at its intersection with NE 1<sup>st</sup> Street and on NE 3<sup>rd</sup> Avenue at its intersection with NE 1<sup>st</sup> Street were identified for new pedestrian crosswalks, as part of the City of Fort Lauderdale 'Connecting the Blocks' masterplan through the Downtown Walkability Program aimed at making our streets safer. The crosswalks will allow for pedestrian refuge areas within a median and pedestrian actuated crossing lights. The proposed landscape will include native plant material, and high efficiency irrigation (Exhibit 3).

North Andrews Avenue and NE 3<sup>rd</sup> Avenue are Broward County (County) owned roadways and require the City of Fort Lauderdale (City) and County enter into a beautification agreement to assume maintenance responsibilities. Previously, the City Commission executed a Beautification Agreement on July 12, 2016 (Exhibit 2) for the same project. However, Broward County did not execute the 2016 agreement, instead seeking a revised beautification agreement. City staff was advised that the new County Attorney revised the agreement language; therefore, a revised agreement must be executed by the City Commission. The agreement will be brought to the Broward County Commission for approval and will be executed thereafter.

### **Resource Impact**

There is no fiscal impact to the City in 2019. Future expenditures are contingent upon approval and appropriation of the annual budget.
