- **TITLE:** Ordinance Amending Division 4, Citizens' Police Review Board, Section 2-250 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Fort Lauderdale, Florida, to add an alternative finding to the Citizens' Police Review Board's recommendations, and providing for severability, repeal of conflicting ordinances provisions, and an effective date (Commission Districts 1, 2, 3, and 4).

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission approve an amendment to Section 2-250 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Fort Lauderdale, Florida, to add the additional finding of "Policy Failure" as a potential finding of the Citizens' Police Review Board.

Background

In November 2018, the Fort Lauderdale Police Department revised department policy 117.3 (Internal Affairs – Responsibility/Complaint Processing), by adding an additional potential finding of "Policy Failure." "Policy Failure" is defined, within the policy, as "a finding or conclusion that current policies, procedures, rules or regulations covering the situation were non-existent or inadequate; or the employee followed policy but the investigation reals policy changes are recommended." Section 2-250(a)(2) of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Fort Lauderdale requires the Board to recommend findings consistent with Fort Lauderdale Police Department Policy 117.3. Therefore, it is necessary to amend the Code so that the Board's potential findings are consistent with the potential finding of the Office of Internal Affairs.

Resource Impact

There is no fiscal impact associated with this proposed ordinance revision.
