TITLE: Resolution Granting a Waiver of Limitations at 95 Hendricks Isle for the

Installation of a Ten-foot Dock Extension and a Single Mooring Pile –

(Commission District 4)

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission adopt a Resolution granting a Waiver of Limitations for the installation of a ten-foot dock (finger pier) extension and a single mooring pile.

Background

The applicant is seeking a resolution granting a Waiver of Limitations (a waiver to allow mooring structures and mooring pilings to extend beyond the maximum distance as defined by City Code) of Section 47-19.3 (C) and (D) of the Unified Land Development Regulations (ULDR) for the installation of a dock extension to a finger pier and a single mooring pile extending a maximum distance of +/- 35 feet from the property line into the adjacent Karen Canal.

Although there is not a fee associated with obtaining a Waiver of Limitations, an application fee in the amount of \$300.00 is required. The applicant's narrative specifies that the additional distance for the dock extension and associated finger pier are necessary to effectively secure the owner's vessel as it is subject to strong currents and winds, particularly in the event of storms or hurricanes.

The Marine Advisory Board recommended unanimous approval of the application 10 to 0 (see Exhibit 3) at the June 6, 2019 meeting.

Resource Impact

There is a positive fiscal impact in the amount of \$300.
