TITLE: Special Events Policy Discussion (Commission Districts 1, 2, 3 and 4)

At the August 21, 2018 City Commission Conference Meeting, staff presented the Commission with information and recommendations regarding elements of the City's special event policy. Over the last several years, the City has experienced a significant increase in special events held by non-City event organizers and promoters. While the City has enjoyed a renewed activation of its beach and downtown areas, this increase has taken a toll on the City's infrastructure, created traffic congestion, and placed a burden on its resources. In addition, the Commission has expressed an interest in charging additional fees for organizers using our beach. The elements for discussion consisted of:

- Better defining what qualifies as a special event
- A more manageable application deadline
- Fees
- Enforcement of Permit Compliance
- Establishing Special Event Limitation with regards to location, event type, and quantity of events

In response to the presentation, the Commission directed staff to form a "working group" to meet and develop recommendations to bring forward to the City Commission. A working group has since been formed and has met several times. Their recommendations are attached. Please note that the recommendations relate to special events and not the social services also provided for in the not yet codified outdoor event ordinance, C-18-48.

As per direction at the June 18<sup>th</sup> Commission meeting, comments on the group's recommendations from April Kirk, Executive Director for the Stranahan House, are attached.

Staff is seeking direction on the recommendations to incorporate into the outdoor events ordinance and special event policy.

## **Strategic Connections**
