6/20/19 Communication to Commission: Amended since June 2019 regarding standards

We want to thank all of you for the commitment you have shown to the 20,016 Fort Lauderdale residents who attend public schools. We are honored by your enthusiasm shown during the recent Joint City Commission Workshop on Education. We accept your task to come back in 3-6 months and look forward to presenting an update on education in Fort Lauderdale.

We made specific recommendations at our Joint Workshop and recommend that the Commission take the following actions, with the methods (resolution, proclamation, policy statement, or other) that best motivate expeditious actions or adoption:

- One, adopt a policy that encourages the creation of Early Learning Centers designed and implemented to improve early literacy and otherwise prepare students for starting school.
- Two, establish an urgent requirement for the City to plan with Broward County Schools' staff and City principals to establish joint-use parks and recreation facilities at, or near, all 28 schools with the goal of optimizing the City and County parks and recreation investments as soon as possible.
- Three, support the City in establishing education standards
 - All schools in the City achieve state grades of "A" or "B"
 - Support efforts that improve the percent of students who achieve at least a one year learning gain
 - Adopt one-year learning gain with a qualitative modifier as the standard
