AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTIONS 28-76, 28-141, 28-143, 28-144, AND 28-145, OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF FORT LAUDERDALE, FLORIDA, PROVIDING FOR INCREASES TO WASTEWATER RATES, TAPPING CHARGES, WATER RATES, MASTER METER CHARGES, SERVICE AVAILABILITY CHARGES, SPRINKLING CHARGES, FIRE SERVICE CHARGES, AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, REPEAL OF THE ANNUAL REBATE TEST, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City of Fort Lauderdale ("City") supplies water and sewer services on a regional basis to approximately 250,000 residents of central Broward County; and

WHEREAS, areas provided potable water service and wastewater service by the City include Fort Lauderdale, Port Everglades, Sea Ranch Lakes, Lauderdale-by-the-Sea, Oakland Park, Wilton Manors, and portions of Davie, Tamarac, and unincorporated Broward County; and

WHEREAS, in April 2019, a comprehensive water and sewer rate study was conducted by Stantec Consulting Services, Inc. for the City which established a plan of rate adjustments and rate structure modifications; and

WHEREAS, the necessity for water main replacement and sewer rehabilitation throughout the City and other ongoing capital needs requires an increased level of fund transfers into the capital program; and

WHEREAS, to generate necessary funds for present and future needs, administration, operation and long-range projects under the Water and Sewer Master Plan, it is

necessary to increase wastewater user rates, tapping charges, water rates, sprinkling meter charges, private fire service protection charges, and service availability charges; and

WHEREAS, the City of Fort Lauderdale has notified all customers of this Ordinance through the regular utility billing process, pursuant to Section 180.136, Florida Statutes; and

WHEREAS, the City of Fort Lauderdale will allow the tapping charges for residential accounts installing a secondary meter for irrigation purposes to be paid in installments for a period of up to 18 months with no interest; and

WHEREAS, the proposed amendments to the Code of Ordinances are in the best interests of the health, safety, and welfare of the City and the City's utilities customers;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF FORT LAUDERDALE, FLORIDA:

least ten million dollars (\$10,000,000.00), and 5) there is replacement and repair funding of at least ten million dollars (\$10,000,000.00). If there is projected revenue that exceeds these five (5) criteria, the current customers shall receive a proportionate rebate of the excess funds on their water/wastewater bill in the same fiscal year. For purposes of this note, revenue, expenses, and net revenue are as defined in City Commission Resolution No. 03-29.

<u>SECTION 2</u>. That Section 28-76(b)(2) of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Fort Lauderdale, Florida, establishing wastewater commodity charges and the table titled Wastewater Commodity Charges contained in Section 28-76(b)(2), is hereby amended as follows:
