Lauderdale, Entitled "Human Relations" (Commission Districts 1, 2, 3

and 4)

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission adopt the attached Ordinance amending the Code of Ordinances of the City of Fort Lauderdale, Florida, by creating Chapter 29, entitled "Human Relations," to prohibit discrimination in employment, public accommodations, real estate transactions and against families with children in multifamily rental housing, to provide for rights and legal effects of domestic partnerships, and to prohibit conversion therapy on minors.

Background

The City of Fort Lauderdale (the "City") is committed to securing for all individuals within the City freedom from discrimination because of race, color, religion, sex, national origin, age, marital status, political affiliation, familial status, disability, sexual orientation, pregnancy, gender identity or expression, veteran or service member status, lawful source of income, or being the victim of dating violence, domestic violence, or stalking, in connection with employment, public accommodations, or real estate transactions, where applicable, and thereby to promote the interests, rights, and privileges of individuals within the City.

The attached Ordinance is proposed to supplement federal, state, and county antidiscrimination laws, including but not limited to the Broward County Human Rights; Florida Civil Rights Act of 1992, as amended; Titles II, III, and VII of the Federal Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended; Title VIII of the Federal Civil Rights Act of 1968, as amended; Section 504 of the Federal Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended; the Civil Rights Act of 1991, as amended; the Age Discrimination and Employment Act of 1967, as amended; and the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, as amended. The proposed Ordinance amends the Code of Ordinances of the City by creating Chapter 29, entitled "Human Relations," to prohibit discrimination in employment, public accommodations, real estate transactions and against families with children in multifamily rental housing, to provide for rights and legal effects of domestic partnerships, and to prohibit conversion therapy on minors.
