the Execution of a Grant Agreement with the Fort Lauderdale Downtown Development Authority for the One-Way Pair Mobility Study - \$25,000 -

(Commission Districts 2 and 4)

Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission adopt a resolution authorizing the City Manager to execute a Grant Agreement with the Fort Lauderdale Downtown Development Authority to accept funding in the amount of \$25,000 supporting the traffic analysis of the One-Way Pair Mobility Study in Downtown Fort Lauderdale.

Background

In September 2018, the City Commission was presented with an opportunity to convert Andrews Avenue and 3rd Avenue in Downtown Fort Lauderdale to a one-way pair network. This concept would create dedicated transit lane facilities and possible offstreet bike facilities along these two main arterials within the heart of the business district. Commissioners were supportive of moving into the first phase of this project, which includes a detailed traffic analysis to understand the opportunities and constraints of vehicular movements along these corridors by converting to one-way operations.

This study has been scoped with one of the City's traffic engineering consultants for a total fee of \$200,000. The funding will include three sources. The City of Fort Lauderdale (\$75,000) and the Downtown Development Authority (\$25,000) will partner together for a total of \$100,000. Additionally, Broward County will match the contribution of \$100,000, for a grand total of \$200,000.

A local funding agreement will be prepared to accept \$100,000 from Broward County.

Resource Impact

There will be a no current year fiscal impact.

Strategic Connections

This item is a *Press Play Fort Lauderdale Strategic Plan 2018 initiative*, included within the Infrastructure Cylinder of Excellence, specifically advancing:

- Objective 1: Improve transportation options and reduce congestion by working with agency partners.
- Objective 3: Improve pedestrian, bicycle, and vehicular safety.
