

Our patented equipment and cleaning methods have been developed based on over 40 years of experience and are tailored to each client's specific needs. Beach Raker is responsible for cleaning some of the most densely populated beaches and congested waterways in the United States.

We are the only full-time, professional private company of this type in the State of Florida. Beach Raker has over 35 employees and current operates in 7 counties. A full list of references and projects currently and formally completed are listed with each reference. Beach Raker is under contract with 14 municipalities currently. Beach Raker is fully licensed, insured and permitted by all the state and local regulatory agencies. Ray is responsible for the fleet of Ford truck, Kubota tractors, Omni Catamarans, Barber Surf Rakes, Beach Tech Sanitizers and all other miscellaneous equipment. Ray also has designed and fabricated several pieces of equipment which is patented and proprietary to Beach Raker.

Brick Kerge – Operations Manager Waterways– 35 years experience Brick is Beach Raker's operation manager for all coastal and intercoastal waterway projects. Brick has over 10,000 hours on the water managing vessels up to 75 feet. Brick works closely with FFWCC, DEP and all County regulators to insure Beach Raker is compliant with all of the regulations regarding waterway cleaning methods. Brick is proficient in operating all types of marine vessels and is responsible for the training and supervision of the operators who work on the water.

Equipment:

Beach Raker plans to utilize a mix of both Omni Catamarans and Carolina Skiffs to exceed the requirements set forth in the City's RFP Bid 12285-595. Each vessel is specially sized to be accessible to the entire 165-mile canal system. Each vessel will have specialized equipment which will be used to remove floating debris, larger debris that maybe submersed or immersed within vegetation, dislodge debris from tight spaces or adjacent to private property and have rapid disposal to reduce dwell times. Beach Raker employs a fleet of trucks, Ford F550s and F450s, that have different size dump trailers that are maneuverable enough to grant access to the tightest of areas. The equipment is further displayed in the Operations Plan.

Tracking:

Beach Raker uses the Verizon Revel Fleetmatics program to track its fleet of over 50 vehicles. This program provides real time data reporting on speed and activity. Activity logs are maintained indefinitely and can be provided to the City immediately following a request. This system allows Beach Raker to ensure that all clients are serviced in a timely and safe manner. See the attached example at the end of this section.

Disposal:

Beach Raker uses its fleet of trucks to properly dispose of all debris. Beach Raker ensures that no debris is placed on the ground, shorelines or parking lots once collected. Beach Raker will utilize its own equipment to transfer the debris from the Omni Catamarans and Skiffs to the trucks.

Beach Raker will utilize the closest access points to reduce dwell times. Beach Raker currently collects between 30,000 and 40,000 pounds of debris a week, excluding seaweed. Seaweed is tracked on a daily basis but reported monthly and Beach Raker current hauls more than 2,500 cubic yards a month to permitted disposal sites. These logs are maintained by Beach Rakers corporate headquarters and supplied to the clients on a monthly or as requested basis.



Work Schedule

The work schedule will be designed to maintain a continual cleanup process not to exceed the required 4-week cycles 12 times per year. We also understand the city may modify weekly work based on the amount of debris, observation, calls from the public and any other factors such as special events. Each boat captain will have a cell phone to be in immediate and direct contact upon the city's needs. We have a commitment to conserving the cleanliness of the waterways and canals.

Monday-Friday (0500-1300)

- O Start at or around sunrise and work until the 8.25 miles on average per day is achieved. If 2 boats are used then each boat will be required to provide a minimum of 4.13 miles per day. If 3 boats are used then each boat will be required to maintain a minimum of 2.75 miles per day.
- Saturday and Sunday are left for makeup days due to weather delays or special events.
- We will also adjust schedules based on the local tidal charts with fixed bridges so we can utilize the correct equipment for the specific need.
- o In the events of holidays and or special events, we will adjust and work specific zones to make sure the work is complete and not be intrusive to the City.
- We will utilize the marine forecasts, tidal chart and track any storm.
- We will not operate under the following conditions; Lightning, Winds in excess of 25 knots or storms.
- o Our schedule will be written utilizing 6 employees.

All work schedules shall conform to all applicable codes and ordinances and will be the least disruptive to homeowners and boat traffic.

OPERATIONS PLAN

The operations plan is a fluid document that is used as an outline for Beach Raker's detailed training guides. The operations plans and training guides are reviewed during the monthly operations meetings and changes are implemented immediately.

At the monthly meetings, marine forecasts are examined to include tidal charts and wind predictions. During hurricane season, storms are also tracked. This information is used to determine which areas are accessible during Beach Raker's normal operating hours. The zones to be cleaned daily will fluctuate with the tidal cycle and the desire of the City of Fort Lauderdale.

The forecasts will determine which location the boats will be launched from. Beach Raker will keep two boats in the water and one boat will be trailered to the appropriate location.

A typical workday will be from 0500 – 1300 Monday through Friday.

Saturday, Sunday and Holidays will be used as overflow days.

Beach Raker will be operational except for the following conditions.

- Lightning
- Winds in excess of 25 knots
- Local Storm warnings

Listed below is a daily schedule.

Arrival at dock (0500)

- Morning briefing to review assigned cleaning areas, disposal and alternate disposal locations, and review the daily weather forecast.
- Check boats (pre-trip inspection)
 - o Check operator safety equipment
 - o Check lights
 - Check fluid levels
 - Check equipment operation

Launch boat (Sunrise)

- Movement to the assigned areas
 - o Record photos or video of area to be cleaned
 - o Immediately report any large objects that will need to be removed
 - Verify/request disposal trucks in a timely manner
- Clean Canal as per schedule
 - Use Elastec Omni Catamaran pontoon boat, Carolina Skiff or Omni Landing Craft to skim the water removing any debris
 - Use flat boat to assist in picking up large debris in water way
 - A high-volume pump and water canon will be used to move debris from under docks and inaccessible areas

Debris Disposal (As required designated disposal locations)

- Exchange or empty Omni Catamaran pods as required utilizing secondary vessel or disposal truck, as required
- Meet refuse truck at a pre-determined shoreline approved site to off-load debris for disposal
- Transport refuse to the appropriate approved disposal site utilizing dump trailers and trucks
- Collect and record dump tickets for proper documentation, inspection and dissemination monthly to the City of Fort Lauderdale

Post trip inspection (1200)

- Daily
 - Wash down boats using a desalinization solution
 - o Fuel up
 - o Record any maintenance issues for repair
 - Secure boats for overnight storage
 - o Document any areas of concern along the waterways observed during transit
- Monthly
 - o Change the oil in the outboard motors
 - o Grease the boat fittings
 - o Inspect the safety gear
 - o Wax the fiberglass portions of the boats

Daily administrative duties

- Record dump tickets
- Log any large items removed from waterway
- Save photos and video from the day's work
- Review/print GPS report

The basket has fine perforated aluminum side panels, plated base The 99 cubic feet / 2.8 cubic meter capacity basket collects floating trash and with drain holes, forward hinged mesh gate and aft section non-return gate (2 debris and features aluminum locking locating bolts for secure positioning for secure crane hoisting.




Work Schedule

The work schedule will be designed to maintain a continual cleanup process not to exceed the required 4-week cycles 12 times per year. We also understand the city may modify weekly work based on the amount of debris, observation, calls from the public and any other factors such as special events. Each boat captain will have a cell phone to be in immediate and direct contact upon the city's needs. We have a commitment to conserving the cleanliness of the waterways and canals.

Monday-Friday (0500-1300)


- Start at or around sunrise and work until the 8.25 miles on average per day is achieved. If 2 boats are used then each boat will be required to provide a minimum of 4.13 miles per day. If 3 boats are used then each boat will be required to maintain a minimum of 2.75 miles per day.
- Saturday and Sunday are left for makeup days due to weather delays or special events.
- We will also adjust schedules based on the local tidal charts with fixed bridges so we can utilize the correct equipment for the specific need.
- o In the events of holidays and or special events, we will adjust and work specific zones to make sure the work is complete and not be intrusive to the City.
- We will utilize the marine forecasts, tidal chart and track any storm.
- o We will not operate under the following conditions; Lightning, Winds in excess of 25 knots or storms.
- Our schedule will be written utilizing 6 employees.

All work schedules shall conform to all applicable codes and ordinances and will be the least disruptive to homeowners and boat traffic.



Monitoring and Tracking via Fleetmatics

Beach Raker uses the Verizon Revel Fleetmatics program to track its fleet of over 50 vehicles. This program provides real time data reporting on speed and activity. Activity logs are maintained indefinitely and can be provided to the City immediately following a request. This system allows Beach Raker to ensure that all clients are serviced in a timely and safe manner. See the attached example at the end of this section.

Reporting Deliverables

Weekly 3.7.1

Beach Raker will report within 2 business days on all waterways cleaned as clear of debris utilizing dump tickets as evidence as well as any areas of concern for future work. We will also provide a map of the areas cleaned.

Monthly 3.7.2

Beach Raker will provide a summary report within 5 business days identifying total weight of debris removed, any areas of concern including pictures and video documentation of before and after with a minimum of one day per week.

Annually 3.7.3

Beach Raker will provide within 5 business days an operational recommendation to the City for future subsequent renewal periods. This report will include the highest volume locations and the frequency along with any items of relevance. This report will include the total weight of debris removed as an aggregate of the monthly reporting.
