**TITLE**: Motion Approving Increase in Funds to Contract for Electrical Engineering,

Instrumentation and Telemetry Consulting Services - Smith Engineering

Consultants, Inc. - \$548,000 - (Commission Districts 1, 2, 3 and 4)

#### Recommendation

It is recommended that the City Commission approve an increase in funds to the contract for electrical engineering, instrumentation and telemetry consulting services with Smith Engineering Consultants, Inc., in the total amount of \$548,000 for a new contract total of \$848,000.

## Background

On November 20, 2018, the City Commission awarded Contract No. 12159-286 for electrical engineering, instrumentation and telemetry consulting services to Smith Engineering Consultants, Inc. This contract is for \$300,000 for a two-year term with the option to renew for two successive one-year terms (CAM 18-0860).

Since November 2018, four task orders have been submitted totaling \$294,624 out of the \$300,000 contract cap with a remaining balance of \$5,376. Below is a list of the ongoing projects:

However, Public Works staff inadvertently requested insufficient funds to pay for all the projects they had identified for FY2020-FY2021 Community Investment Plan requiring electrical consultant services. Additional funds in the amount of \$548,000 are needed to pay for the following projects:

Staff recommends increasing the contract amount by an additional \$548,000 to cover the cost of these important projects at the City's water treatment plants in the current FY 2020.
